## PETERSON JOINS STAFF IN STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS

W. Timothy Peterson, 29, has been named as a second assistant director of the Office of Student Organizations, Dudley Woodard, dean of Student Life, has announced. The appointment is effective immediately.

Peterson and Cindy Livingston, a member of the staff since March of 1973, share responsibilities as co-assistant directors and report to Ingo Dutzmann, coordinator of Student Organizations, Woodard explained.

Peterson, since 1971, has been minister of 1st Church of Perth Amboy, N. J. He holds an A.A. degree in liberal arts from Gardner Webb College, a B.A. degree from Wake Forest University, and a M. Div. degree in community ministry from Crozer Theological Seminary. He has done postgraduate study in student counseling at Andover Newton Theological Seminary.

## REGISTRATION FIGURES ON TARGET FOR FALL, 1973

Fall headcount registration now totals 6,375 students and final figures should bring the university to its project goal of 8,875 for fall, 1973, Thomas H. Atkinson, director of administrative services, has announced.

The 6,375 headcount figure includes freshman and transfer students and continuing students who registered before their regular Aug. 31 deadline, Atkinson said. No breakdown is available at this time on the number of freshman and transfer students, he said.

Final headcount figures will not be known for some time, but an additional 2,500 students in headcount are expected from the following sources: undergraduate late registration, 400; Providence Hospital nurses, 275; late on-campus evening registration, 100; extension centers, 75; Academy of Dramatic Art students, 50; on-campus graduates, 400; off-campus graduates, 1,200.

It will be several weeks before course information is processed and the university knows what the full-time equivalent student figures are for the fall, Atkinson said.

## LIBOFF IS CO-CHAIRMAN OF INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE

Abraham R. Liboff, chairman of the Department of Physics, will deliver an address and serve as co-chairman of an international conference on "Electrically Mediated Growth Mechanisms In Living Systems," to be held Sept. 19-21 in New York City.

He has received a \$2,000 grant from Johnson & Johnson to attend the program that is sponsored by the Biological and Medical Sciences Section of the New York Academy of Sciences.

In addition to serving as co-chairman, Professor Liboff will collaborate with Professor Milton Furst of New York's Hunter College in an address entitled "Pyroelectric Effect In Collagenous Structures." The other conference co-chairman is Professor R. A. Rinaldi of New York University. Participants include experts from Brazil, Canada, Great Britain, Japan, Poland, the United States, and West Germany.

## RAHMAN IS MEMBER OF URDU ADVISORY BOARD

Munibur Rahman, modern languages, has been named to the Urdu Advisory Board of the Sahitya Akademi, the Indian National Academy of Letters. In addition, five of his poems have been published in an anthology of modern Urdu poetry entitled The Journey of New Poetry, edited by Khalilur Rahman Azmi, published in 1972. Professor Rahman also served as an advisor to Professor Azmi in the selection of poems for this volume, which is being cited by critics as the best anthology of modern Urdu poetry yet published.

### NEW SIDEWALK, MALL NEAR COMPLETION

Two construction projects are aiding the pedestrian traffic patterns on campus. The projects include a library mall and new sidewalk installation near Vandenberg Hall. The construction is financed with site development money.

The new walk and stepped ramp system is nearing completion on the west side of Vandenberg Hall. The system enables motorists to walk from parking lot L down the west side of Vandenberg to the south front entrance. The traffic to and from the building is increasing now that it is used as a residence and a faculty classroom-office building. The major walkway of concrete has a minimum of 10-foot-wide walks. An egg-shaped plaza with trees and grass is located at the top of the slope on the west side. Total cost is approximately \$10,000.

Nearing completion is a library mall located west of Kresge Library and between Hannah Hall of Science and South Foundation Hall. The area was used as a parking lot and street complex, but all traces of vehicle traffic have been removed and an asphalt system of walks covering 6,500 square feet has been installed. Circular, graded accent areas will contain trees, flowers and shrubs. Total cost of the project is approximately \$40,000.
