CTA GROUP BECOMES CTA/UAW

The 250-member Clerical-Technical Association has voted 123-36 to become the CTA/UAW, an autonomous local of the International Union, United Automobile, Aerospace and Agricultural Implement Workers of America/UAW.

The UAW will represent the local in 1975-76 contract negotiations between the CTA/UAW local and the university. The vote was taken Thursday, October 24. Recognition by the university is pending.

TASK FORCE CONSIDERS FACILITIES USE TAX CONCEPT

Should OU move to a facilities use tax concept that would ask all members of the community to help support all campus transportation programs?

A special presidential task force has been appointed to discuss the question, hold hearings within the university community, and make a recommendation to the president no later than Dec. 15, 1974, on the feasibility of implementing the program for the 1975-76 fall term.

Members of the task force are Colleen Dolan, employment relations, Glen Brown, campus development, William Connellan, president's office, Bob McGarry, business office, Corey Van Fleet, Physical Education and Athletics, and Rosalind Andreas, commuter services.

The facilities use concept would tax the entire university community for all campus transportation programs including bus service, bicycle paths, ride pool, walkways, and parking lots.

The concept was proposed last year by a special task force on the basis that it would eliminate the need for parking decals, reduce administrative costs and generate additional revenue.

In addition to forming the task force to study the facilities use pay concept, President Donald D. O'Dowd has announced a three month trial of a modified undesignated parking plan which started Monday, Nov. 4, and which will run through Friday, Jan. 31. Some resident, ride pool and paraplegic parking is being protected, otherwise individuals may park where they please regardless of the nature of their current parking decal.

**REDDY ASKED TO SPEAK
AT INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM**

Venkat N. Reddy, professor and assistant director of the Institute of Biological Sciences, was one of only 10 persons invited to give a paper at the International Symposium on the Genesis of Glaucoma held Oct. 16-19 at the Eye Clinic of the Technical University of Munich. His topic was "Aqueous Humor Formation."

The symposium was dedicated to the memory of Karl Wessely, an internationally known German ophthalmologist. Among the best known visitors internationally were Hans Goldmann of Bern, Switzerland and Ernst Bárány of Upsala, Sweden.

Following the symposium, Professor Reddy visited the eye clinics of Minden, Westfalia, Bonn and Aachen to discuss his current research on cataracts.

The honor of being chosen to attend the symposium is the second to come to OU's Institute of Biological Sciences in the past month. The institute was host Oct. 10-13 to 50 leading researchers for the annual conference on biochemistry of the eye.
