Meetings

September 21, 2015: Charge, budget overview, confidentiality, RAM & Research website, review processes, and introductions.

October 19, 2015: Budget review due to new contract; Steering Committee Suggestions with agreement to continue discussing (1) term length; (2) more specific criteria for future review processes; and (3) increasing specificity of feedback to unfunded faculty. The first five fellowships were discussed.

October 26, 2015 – Discussion of faculty fellowship applications continued.

November 2, 2015 – Discussion continued

November 13, 2015 – Discussion continued

November 16, 2015 – Discussion continued.

November 18 2015 – Discussed and voted on F15 Student Travel / Research Awards via email.

Recommended 10 out of 25 applicants. Emailed recommendations to ORA.

November 23, 2015 – Discussion of Faculty Fellowships concluded. Voting took place via emailed spreadsheets. Recommended 27 out of 54 funded based on majority of URC membership endorsing.

Jan 22, 2016 – Agreed to propose an increase in membership to 14; memo to be sent to Senate Steering Committee. Agreed to propose an increase in research award to 3000 from 1200.

Feb 12, 2016 – Discussion and review of Faculty Research Awards. Best 13 identified. Voting via email for 3 additional awardees from the nine applications in the next tier. Research Excellence

Award – Discussion pertained to the receipt of only one application, which did not meet minimum

criteria. (Later – the provost extended the deadline until March 10th at 5 PM so that an awardee could be identified. This was one day before our meeting on March 11th, 2016.)

Feb 24, 2016 – Review of Winter 2016 Student Travel/Research Awards begins via email. On March 4th, we recommended that 10 out of 30 be funded. Final vote emailed to the Office of Research Administration

Feb 24, 2016 – Emailed the list of 16 Faculty Research Awards to be funded to the Office of Research Administration.

March 11, 2016 – Discuss and Vote on New Investigator and Research Excellence Awardees (deadline extended so more applications could be considered – see above). Discussion of membership increase proposal. Presentation of report from Julia Rodriguez regarding open access reimbursement process being developed by the library. The URC will not be involved in the library processes, but future chair should be aware that these options exist.

April 15, 2016 – President's Colloquium Discussion and Vote. Voted to recommend Scott Pickett. Provost and president advised expeditiously.

Significant Topics of Discussion

- Research Excellence Award application deadline extended this year from January 25 to February 1 due to lack of applicants. However, there were no viable applications as of February 12. The Provost decided to re-open the application process on February 24th, concluding on March 10th at 5 PM just before our March 11th URC Meeting.
- Faculty New Investigator Research Excellence Award application deadline extended this year from January 25 to February 1 due to lack of applications.
- Student Research Awards we received over 50 applications for Student Research, and funded 20. A notice was added last year about the increase in competitiveness, and with a first author preference, but we still received a large quantity of applications. The majority of these awards are for travel.
- Membership Increase. After much discussion, the URC membership voted to recommend an increase to twelve members. This memo was forwarded to the Senate Steering Committee in April 2016.
