The Committee met regularly on a weekly basis, in the Fall Semester from Thursday, October 19, 2000 through Friday, December 15, 2000; and in the Winter Semester from January 18, 2001 through April 12, 2001. With few exceptions the meetings were held in Room 125 of the Oakland Center, on Thursday mornings from 8 a. m. until 10 a. m. The meetings were extraordinarily well-attended by practically all committee members.

We considered our charge to be four-fold:

1) to evaluate applications for internal funding for faculty fellowships and for various faculty and student grants;

2) to revise and streamline the application forms and procedures for such funding, to reflect our new web-based, application capacities.

3) to host the three President's Colloquia held during the current academic year;

4) to select the awardees for the President's Colloquia for the academic year 2001-2002, as well as the awardees of the New Investigator Research Excellence Award and the Research Excellence Award.

During the Fall Semester, the Committee evaluated some thirty-eight faculty summer research fellowship applications and awarded seventeen fellowships to the following faculty members:

One Meadowbrook Hall Research Conference Grant was awarded to Eric Follo from CIL for the Conference on: "Linkage of course work and field work in the preparation of teachers for diversity" for \$2800.

Twelve Student Research Grants were awarded for a total of \$5455. Seven student applicants were granted Student Research Travel Grants for a total of \$2800.

From an outstanding group of candidates, the Research Committee chose David Maines as the recipient of the Research Excellence Award, and Kathleen Pfeiffer as the recipient of the New Investigator Research Excellence Award.

There were three awardees for the President's Colloquium this year: Virinder Moudgil, Albert Meehan and Barry Winkler.

Finally, the Research Committee spent a number of meetings and a good deal of time revising the rules and guidelines for grant applications. The results of these guidelines revisions are available on the Oakland University Research webpage and in the booklet that the faculty received at the beginning of the Fall Semester 2001.

It was a great pleasure to serve on the Research Committee, and an especially great honor to serve as the chair over this past year. The committee was composed of some of the most dedicated, capable and professional individuals I have ever met at Oakland University. Furthermore, the opportunity to become aware of the fine research the faculty of Oakland University conducts has been inspiring and motivating for my own career.
