


Here's to providing quality education, diligent research and dedicated community service.

Oakland University has begun its second quarter-century of service well positioned to meet the challenges of the 1980s and beyond.

Now an established, comprehensive research institution, the university has not rested on its laurels. There has been a vigorous review of the university's role and mission; there has been an increased emphasis on excellence in all university programs; and there have been renewed efforts to mount services in the areas of technology transfer and industry and community needs for non-traditional students.

University enrollment has stabilized at nearly 12,000 students, despite generally declining student populations throughout the state. Oakland now offers more than 70 undergraduate and 24 master's programs of study, and doctoral programs in engineering, reading and the biomedical sciences. Oakland President Joseph E. Champagne notes that new undergraduate general education requirements ensure a breadth of education, even if students select one of the popular career-oriented majors.

Nor has the growing adult population been neglected in university planning. The university's Division of Continuing Education continues its aggressive programs for nontraditional adult learners. The division is responsible for credit courses at a dozen extension sites and for noncredit course department programming, including specific university-level

programs for the particular requirements of business and industry, governmental units, schools, and other organizations in the area.

If student needs have been considered, so too have the needs of area industry. The university is moving to provide increased consulting services and retraining programs where needed. Its part in forming the Oakland Technology Park, which now includes automotive technology, computer and banking operations, ensures its role in the continuing economic expansion of the region.

In addition, the university's impact on the region continues. Of Oakland's more than 27,000 alumni, 70 percent live and work in the tri-county area. A labor-intensive enterprise, the bulk of the university's budget each year goes into payrolls, with much of those funds being returned to local communities for housing, entertainment, and goods and services. In terms of employees (approximately 1,400 full- and part-time workers), the institution ranks 20th among 25,000 Oakland County employers.

President Champagne has also stressed the importance of community service in helping the institution maintain credibility and public support. That effort will receive increased emphasis during 1985. Academic units now provide consulting and research services to automotive companies in computer graphics and statistical quality control; provide engineering work and technical writing skills courses for the U.S. Army Tank and Automotive Command; provide new bedside care technology. for a major area hospital; offer free

job counseling for unemployed area residents; present seminars through the Center for International Programs for firms hoping to do business in Japan and China; help establish a museum and excavate Thomas A. Edison's boyhood home in Port Huron; and perform hundreds of dance concerts for area school children. And, a new health maintenanceenhancement center will aid in the maintenance of wellness and in cardiac rehabilitation for patients in a six-county area. These are just a few examples of the exciting and relevant efforts in progress at Oakland.

But perhaps no accomplishment of the first 25 years stirs more pride than Oakland's emergence as a research institution. And at Oakland, undergraduate as well as graduate students play a significant part in many of the faculty accomplishments in research.

Oakland's faculty attracted outside grant and contract support of its projects to the extent of nearly \$4.5 million in 1984. Some \$2 million in research alone ranks Oakland fifth among the state's 15 publicly assisted colleges and universities.

"Although carrying the state's highest average teaching load, Oakland's faculty has distinguished itself in a variety of fields," says Oakland Provost Keith R. Kleckner. "Our engineers are developing new methods for materials testing, new operating systems for microcomputers, new manufacturing techniques for mass-produced products, and new control methods for both ground and air vehicles. Our biochemists






are investigating the nature of possible cures for such diseases as herpes II and leukemia. Other Oakland biochemists are studying endocrine disorders, the regeneration of healthy heart muscle following heart attack damage and the processes of tissue aging."


He cites additional examples. "Vision researchers at Oakland University are exploring the mechanism of cataract formation, glaucoma development and various disorders of the retina of the eye. Medical physicists in Oakland's Department of Physics are ascertaining the interactions between electromagnetic radiation and living tissue, and are developing techniques for predicting the onset of dangerous fluid pressure build-ups in the brain following head injuries. Oakland chemists are working in areas ranging from the development of techniques for preserving food without refrigeration to fundamental electrochemical research that applies to the design of storage batteries."

The quality of Oakland's research is attested to not only by the significant level of external financial support but also by national - and in many cases international - peer recognition. Oakland's faculty members receive numerous invitations to participate in major international symposiums in their research fields. Several faculty members have received prestigious awards in recognition of their research accomplishments. For example, Professor Frank J. Giblin of the Institute of Biological Sciences holds the Rhoto Award for vision research, and Professor Venkat Reddy, director of the Institute of

Biological Sciences, holds the Friedenwald Award signifying outstanding contributions to vision research. Professor Arun Roy's pioneering studies on the biological mechanisms of aging have attracted the attention of the Nobel Committee, which invited him to be among a select international group of scientists presenting their work at the 1983 Nobel Symposium.

As a smaller and relatively new member of Michigan's college and university constellation, Oakland University differs from the large research institutions, such as-the University of Michigan, Michigan State University and Wayne State University, in one fundamental way: Oakland has not had the resources to pursue research across a broad array of fields as have the other universities. Oakland has, therefore, chosen to concentrate institutional resources and develop major research thrusts and advanced graduate programs in just a few areas. However, while Oakland's volume of research activity is below that of the "big three," the quality and importance of Oakland's research accomplishments is every bit as significant.

In just 25 years of existence, Oakland University has established a research record that has brought it substantial national recognition and has attracted external research funding which surpasses that of all but four of the state's public four-year institutions. Oakland University is a significant contributor to university research in Michigan, and its future looks bright under the increasing scholarship of its dedicated faculty.



The best-kept secret in town?

What is the best-kept secret in your town? Who's having an affair? Whose automobile was repossessed for missing payments? Who imbibed too much at the Christmas party? Whose children are out of control?

At Oakland University the best-kept secret is neither scandalous nor titillating. It is that the university has exciting, high-quality public presentations in the arts in addition to those offered by the Meadow Brook enterprises — art gallery, music festival, hall and theatre.

These are the presentations in art, dance, mime, classical and popular music, and theatre that develop out of the academic programs of the College of Arts and Sciences' Department of Music and Department of Theatre and Dance, and special programs and events sponsored by the Center for the Arts.

Oakland's departments of Music and Theatre and Dance — which are to be merged into a single Department of Music, Theatre and Dance in August 1985 — offer Bachelor of Arts in Music, Bachelor of Music and Master of Music degrees, and a Bachelor of Science degree in Music Education. Minors are offered in music, theatre and dance.

The classroom and performance requirements of these various majors and minors are taught and directed by a distinguished faculty of professionals dedicated to instructing young people in the arts. In Oakland's music pressum, to take only the most pron nent examples, James Dawson performs with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra and the Detroit Contemporary Chamber Ensemble; John Dovaras is music director at Kirk in the Hills and leads choral tours to Europe each summer to perform at such sites as the Sistine Chapel in the Vatican and the Cathedral of St. Stephen in Vienna. Flavio Varani concertizes regularly in Europe and South America, as well as in this country.

Marvin "Doc" Holladay has his own jazz quartet and jazz orchestra,

and played with Dizzy Gillespie during the 1984 Montreaux/Detroit Jazz Festival. Lyle Nordstrom directs the highly respected early music ensemble, The Musicians of Swanne Alley. David Daniels conducts both the Pontiac-Oakland and the Warren Symphony orchestras. The most recent addition to the faculty, basso John Paul White, performs in concerts and operas in Europe and in this country.

The commercial music program of the department also leads to a degree, and is home to a number of student ensembles, the best known of which is the Meadow Brook Estate. This program will have a new director in August 1985 and its future is bright.

In theatre, the university has this year secured the services of Yolanda Fleischer, one of Michigan's most respected directors, who directed Thorton Wilder's Matchmaker in March. Adeline Hirschfeld-Medalia has directed such recent successes as George Bernard Shaw's Pygmalion and Luigi Pirandello's Man, Beast, and Virtue. T. Andrew Aston, who is artistic director of the university's Mime Ensemble, directed William Gibson's The Miracle Worker and Gilbert and Sullivan's Pirates of Penzance.

In dance, Carol Halsted's ensemble, Other Things & Company, tours schools throughout

Michigan during the academic year, and has brought fun to thousands of children. The dance program offers courses at all levels in dance performance, history and choreography. In addition, dance workshops with guest artists are offered throughout the year, and there is an active evening community dance program. New faculty will be hired to bolster the dance program during the 1985-86 academic year.

The Center for the Arts is involved in special educational projects not directly related to the university's credit-bearing, degree-oriented academic programs. Each summer, in cooperation with Oakland Schools, the center offers two Arts-for-Youth camps. These are two-week day camp programs

in art, dance, mime, music and theatre for children aged 6 through 15. Among other activities, the youngsters attend performances at the Meadow Brook Music Festival and give their own program at the end of each camp.

In March and April the center sponsored, in cooperation with the Department of Art and Art History, a symposium on the life and art of artist James Abbott McNeill Whistler in Meadow Brook Hall, and an exhibition of Whistler's graphics in the Meadow Brook Art Gallery. In June the center sponsored, in cooperation with the College of Arts and Sciences Alumni Affiliate, a Gilbert and Sullivan Gala in Meadow Brook Hall, timed to coincide with its production of Pirates of Penzance.

During its first subscription series season, Center for the Arts guest performers included pianist William Doppmann, Ars Musica: the Baroque Orchestra, and the Detroit Dance Collective.

As this article is being written, the center's 1985-86 season has not been finalized, but it will include a recital by Flavio Varani, a concert by Jasdances, a Chicago dance company, and the annual holiday concert by the Meadow Brook Estate. Theatrical productions will include a new play for children, Zoophabreaks, by the Mime Ensemble, and The Wayside Motor Inn and Man and Superman, directed by Yolanda Fleischer and Adeline Hirschfeld-Medalia, respectively. In addition, the world premiere of the English to slation of William Mewe's early 17th-century Neo-Latin play, False Magic (Pseudomagia), will take place in

October. This play was translated by Brian P. Copenhaver, dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, and John C. Coldewey of the University of Washington. The theatre season will conclude with Rodgers and Hammerstein's Carousel.

In the spring of 1987, the center and the Department of Music, Theatre and Dance hope to produce a trilogy of operas by Stanley Hollingsworth, the university's composer in residence and professor of music. In honor of his 60th birthday, Professor Hollingsworth's music was featured in the Contemporary Music Festival this year.

The Oakland University Center for the Arts and the Department of Music, Theatre and Dance cooperate to educate and to entertain university students and the public. These are highlights of the recent past and the immediate future, some of which are also illustrated in the photographs accompanying this article.

DETROIT SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA

Gunther Herbig, Music Director

The Detroit Symphony Orchestra has been a part of Detroit's cultural and civic life since the Symphony's founding in 1914. In the 71 years since then, its presence has grown in the international community as well, strengthened by an impressive roster of conductors, recordings, a much-heralded European tour and radio broadcasts.

Today's Symphony is testimony to the spirit and vision of a group of civic-minded women who sponsored the first Detroit Symphony concert, conducted by the Symphony's first Music Director, Weston Gales (1914-17).

In the subsequent years, the Symphony gradually built upon its reputation as a world class orchestra through the efforts of guest conductors and music directors Ossip Gabrilowitsch (1919-36); Victor Kolar and Franco Ghione (1936-42); Karl Krueger (1943-49); Paul Paray (1952-62); Sixten Ehrling (1963-73); Aldo Ceccato (1973-77); and Antal Dorati (1977-81).



Its reputation was further enhanced by the appointment in 1984 of Music Director Gunther Herbig, who led the Detroit Symphony at Carnegie Hall this past April in its first New York performance since 1981.

Maestro Herbig was born in Czechoslovakia of Austrian parents, beginning musical studies at the Franz Liszt Academy in Weimar with Hermann Abendroth, a leading German conductor of that time.

Prior to his appointment at the Detroit Symphony, Maestro Herbig was Conductor of the Berlin Symphony (1966-73), General Music Director of the Dresden Philharmonic (1972-77), General Music Director of the Berlin Symphony (1977-83), Principal Guest Conductor of the Dallas Symphony (1979-81), and Principal Guest Conductor of the BBC Philharmonic Orchestra in Manchester (1981-83).

In addition to his conducting, Maestro Herbig has toured with the Dresden Philharmonic and the Leipzig Gewandhaus orchestras, and he has recorded some 35 discs on the Eterna label with the State Orchestra of Berlin, the Berlin Symphony Orchestra and the Dresden Philharmonic. Performances led by Maestro Herbig have been broadcast on radio in Berlin and Leipzig, in Japan, on the BBC in Great Britain, and in Detroit.

This June, Gunther Herbig led the Detroit Symphony in three of four concerts at the Casals Festival in Puerto Rico. Next season he will conduct the Orchestra in the world premiere of an original piano concerto, jointly commissioned by the Detroit Symphony, Carnegie Hall and the American Symphony Orchestra League, and written by Pulitzer Prize-winning composer Ellen Taaffe Zwilich. The New York premiere of the work is scheduled for 1987, performed at Carnegie Hall by the winner of the next Carnegie Hall International American Music Competition, the Detroit Symphony and Gunther Herbig.

Detroit Symphony concerts are regularly broadcast on radio in 12 major markets, including New York, Chicago, Boston and Washington, and on more than 50 National Public Radio stations by satellite feed. The broadcasts are produced by WQRS-FM, and they are sponsored by General Motors Corporation.

Twenty-seven Detroit Symphony recordings are currently available, with four more to be released soon. Among the most popular are Antal Dorati's recordings of Stravinsky's *The Firebird, The Rite of Spring*, for which the compact disc version earned the Grand Prix du Disuqe, and Tchaikovsky's 1812 Overture. All are available on London-Decca.

Meadow Brook Music Festival at Oakland University, north of Detroit, is the Detroit Symphony's home for eight weeks every summer. It is recognized as one of the nation's major summer music festivals. This year's Chrysler Concert Series of Detroit Symphony performances is sponsored by the Chrysler Corporation and the Chrysler Corporation Fund.
