### University Research Committee Annual Report August 15, 2008–August 14, 2009

This annual report includes a financial summary and itemized description of projects funded by or through the University Research Committee (URC) during the 2008-2009 operating cycle. The majority of the Committee's time was spent on the distribution of contract research funds. The Committee spent \$227,890 to support faculty and student research endeavors as well as Meadow Brook Hall Conference support and faculty reimbursement for books, reprints, and page charges. Most of these funds were for the Faculty Research Fellowship. A breakdown of awards, as well as applications, is in the table below.

A few observations about this table may be in order. First, one sees that about half of the research fellowships were funded. Many of those that were not funded were incomplete and thus not evaluated. Moreover, the total number of applications was a little less than in 2007-2008. While we express confidence that we funded worthwhile projects, it would be nice to see more applications. To this end, the application and guidelines have been changed to highlight what a complete application would entail and, more significantly, to allow faculty to receive the fellowship (\$8,500) and teach one summer class. In the past, this was not  $\checkmark$  possible and teaching often paid better than the fellowship. It may also be worth considering increasing the amount of the fellowship to \$10,000, which was also raised in last year's report. We hope that this change will increase applications and perhaps draw applications from those who have not asked the URC for funds in the past. We have also made other alterations in the guidelines to respond to lack of clarity/concerns expressed by faculty during this past year.

One can note as well the smaller number of student applications, all of which were folded into 'travel' above. This year we were able to fund, with the \$4000 allotted, all the students deemed worthy of support. I should note that URC members are reluctant to turn down student applications for research and conference travel, and those that were denied were usually incomplete. Increasing the amount allotted to students, so we could fund more in the future, would be our suggestion.

The URC is grateful for the continued support by President Russi for the President's Colloquium Series. In October 2008, the President's Colloquium Series lecture "Running on or From Iraq," was presented by. David A. Dulio and Peter F. Trumbore, both from the Department of Political Science. The talk was timely given the 2008 elections and well-attended. Discussion was lively, and feedback from the audience was universally positive. Next year's talk will be by Todd Estes from the Department of History on debates over the constitution and their continued relevance today. We are also thankful for the President's support for the Research Excellence Award and New Investigator Research Excellence Awards. These awards provide a mechanism for the University community to recognize and celebrate the accomplishments of well established and junior faculty members. This year the Research Excellence Award went to Dr. Andrei Slavin, Department of Physics, and the New Investigator Research Excellence Award went to Dr. Huirong Fu from the Department of Computer Science and Engineering.

The URC functioned very well this past year. We worked in a cooperative spirit and tried to reach consensus on the awards. This remains one of the busiest, if not THE busiest, faculty committee of the university, and we all acknowledged the importance of the committee's work. I would like to thank my fellow committee members (Laila Guessous, Department of Mechanical Engineering; Lynne Williams, School of Health Sciences; Natalie Cole, Department of English; Carol Liu, School of Business; Barbara Harrison, School of Nursing; Thomas Pedroni, School of Education and Human Services; Abdi Kusow, Department of Sociology and Anthropolgy; and Xiangqun Zeng, Department of Chemistry) for their dedication to the URC, as well as T.C. Yih (ex-officio member), Vice Provost for Research, and Susan Willner, Assistant to the VPR, for their support to the URC.
