Mr. Headlee moved that the gifts and grants be accepted with gratitude. Mr. Katke seconded the motion which was voted on and approved by all of the Trustees present.

Acceptance of Gift of Sculpture from Mr. and Mrs. S. Brooks Barron

Mr. Matthews informed the Board that Mr. and Mrs. S. Brooks Barron, founders of the Meadow Brook Gallery Associates and active supporters of the Meadow Brook Art Gallery program since 1970, have conveyed through Curator Kiichi Usui their wish to commission and donate to Oakland University an outdoor sculpture by Michael Hall entitled, "Sabbath Day." Mr. Matthews then presented the following recommendation for Board approval:

That the Board of Trustees gratefully accept a gift from Mr. and Mrs. S. Brooks Barron of a proposed outdoor sculpture by Michael Hall entitled, "Sabbath Day", without cost to the university.

Mr. Matthews stated that this was a magnificent gift. He wished to clarify the fact that there would be no artist or construction costs but some minimal expenses would be incurred such as increased liability insurance and workers compensation insurance during the course of the sculpture's installation. Maintenance costs

after construction such as painting and repair would be the responsibility of the university. Mr. Matthews noted that it was the hope of the Meadow Brook Art Gallery members to develop a plan aimed at "adorning the campus" with sculptures at various locations.

Mr. Katke stated that the Board was very grateful for the gift and that it should be acknowledged. He inquired as to the approximate value of the gift.

Mr. Kiichi Usui responded that the design cost would be approximately \$15,000 with about \$10,000 in materials. After completion, the sculpture would be appraised by the donors.

At this time Mr. Usui made a slide presentation to the Board of the plans for exhibiting some contemporary sculpture pieces on campus in connection with the Meadow Brook Music Festival in 1981. He also reviewed briefly the method for selecting the artists participating in the exhibit. The Meadow Brook Gallery Associates are trying to develop a plan where one of the participating artists will be chosen to create a sculpture to be permanently installed on the campus. It is the associates' expectation that this practice will become an annual occurrence. By commissioning a work, Mr. and Mrs. S. Brooks Barron hope that other individuals and corporations will follow their example and commission or purchase and donate sculpture to the university.

During Mr. Usui's slide presentation, he presented some examples of Mr. Michael Hall's work. Mr. Usui also displayed a small scale model of the proposed "Sabbath Day" sculpture which he said is somewhat reminiscent of 18th century "Shaker" buildings. Mr. Usui noted that in his opinion this work has a "spiritual" feeling. He added that over the years this sculpture would become important since in his opinion the artist would become nationally recognized. Mr. Usui informed the Board that the work will measure approximately 20 feet in height and 37 feet in width. Currently three locations are being considered for its installation: (1) near the Festival grounds, (2) south of the Library, and (3) west of Varner Hall. Mr. Usui said a plywood mock-up would be constructed to determine the "best location."

Mr. Headlee moved that the gift be accepted with appropriate thanks. Mr. Saltzman seconded the motion.

Mr. Katke inquired if the sculpture was of metal construction.

Mr. Usui responded that it would be made out of steel which would be painted silver on the inside and red on the reverse side.

Mr. Matthews added that it would be the university's responsibility to paint the sculpture about every three or four years.

The motion was voted on and approved by all of the Trustees present.

- Mr. Katke inquired how the university operated with such a large number of leaves of absence. He asked if the students were being "short changed" because of the number of faculty leaves.
- Mr. Obear responded that he did not believe so since before a leave is approved, it is necessary for the faculty member to demonstrate how the instruction duties will be covered. For instance, if it is for one semester, it is absorbed by the department or the college; if the individual is on an extended leave and there is justification, then part-time personnel is hired.
- Mr. Katke asked if these costs were provided for in the budget.
- Mr. Obear said that if the individual was on leave without pay, the budgeted amount of that individual's salary would be used to hire a visiting or part-time instructor.
- Mr. Katke asked if this replacement process followed the same procedure as a permanent replacement of an instructor.
- Mr. Obear said he believed that appointments of full-time visiting instructors would come before the Board for approval, but that part-time appointments were not brought to the Board.
- Mr. Headlee moved that the recommended faculty personnel actions be approved. Mr. Saltzman seconded the motion.
- Mr. Katke inquired about a leave that ran from August 1980 through April 1982.
- Mr. Obear explained that this two-year leave was granted so that the individual could pursue doctoral work.
- The motion to approve the faculty personnel actions was voted on and approved by all of the Trustees present.
- Mr. Matthews added that various inducements were employed to involve individuals in doctoral studies and that sometimes two years are required for the work.

- Mr. Katke inquired if there was an obligation to return to Oakland after a one or two-year leave. He also asked about the status of the replacement.
- Mr. Matthews replied that if the position was filled, it would be by a part-time individual or on a one or two-year basis so that the person on leave could return to the budgeted position.
- Mr. Obear added that if the person on leave is on salary, there is an obligation to return.
- Mr. Katke asked if leaves of absence were at the discretion of management.
 - Mr. Obear assured him that they were management decisions.

Reappointment of Geraldene Felton, Dean of the Faculty and School of Nursing

- Mr. Matthews called upon Mr. Frederick Obear to present the recommendation regarding the reappointment of the Dean of the Faculty and the School of Nursing.
- Mr. Obear stated that in accordance with the Constitution of the School of Nursing, the dean is "appointed for a term not to exceed five years before review." Last fall, Mr. Obear started the review process by meeting with members of the faculty, with two administrative professional staff members of the school; with the president of the student nurses' association, with the chair of the nursing alumni, and with the other academic deans. Following these meetings he formulated the following recommendation which he said he presented "enthusiastically" for Board approval:

That Geraldene Felton, Professor of Nursing, be appointed Dean of the Faculty and School of Nursing effective July 1, 1980, for a second term, not to exceed five years before review.

- Mr. Obear added, however, that Dean Felton would not complete her term of reappointment due to her acceptance of the position of Dean of the College of Nursing at The University of Iowa, effective March 1, 1981.
- Mr. Obear stated that he was "indebted" to Dean Felton for her leadership of the School of Nursing and he was pleased that she would remain at Oakland through most of the next academic year. He added that she and Mr. Matthews had chartered the School of Nursing and that it was a superb program.

Mr. Katke moved that the recommendation to reappoint Dean Felton be approved. Mr. Saltzman seconded the motion.

Mr. Matthews stated that while he could understand Dean Felton's professional reasons for wanting to move on to a more complex program, he personally regretted that she was leaving. He added that her leadership would be "missed."

The motion to approve the reappointment was voted on and approved by all of the Trustees present.

Reappointment of Department Chairpersons

Mr. Matthews called upon Mr. Obear to present the recommendation on the reappointment of department chairpersons.

Mr. Obear stated that department chairpersons are normally appointed for three-year renewable terms, and that before recommending the reappointment of a department chairperson, the appropriate dean or director must review the incumbent's effectiveness with both tenured and non-tenured faculty members in the department. Having completed the review, Mr. Obear presented the following recommendation for the Board's approval:

The following department chairpersons are recommended for appointment to three-year terms, effective August 15, 1980:

Mr. Obear explained that Professor Moeller would not be serving the first year of this reappointment since he has agreed to become the Acting Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences to replace Dean Reuben Torch who has resigned. Mr. John Barthel has been appointed as the acting chairperson of Modern Languages and Literatures until Mr. Moeller returns.

Mr. Headlee moved that the recommendation to approve the reappointment of the department chairpersons be approved. Mr. Saltzman seconded the motion which was voted on and approved by all of the Trustees present.

Approval of Candidates Recommended to Receive Bachelor's and Master's Degrees as of April 24, 1980

Mr. Matthews recommended approval of the candidates for bachelor's and master's degrees as of April 24, 1980. (The list of candidates is on file in the Office of the Secretary to the Board of Trustees.)

Mr. Obear announced that Steven Adam Dopirak, who received a B.S. in Engineering, had been killed on June 2.

Mr. Katke moved that the recommended candidates be approved with congratulations. Mr. Headlee seconded the motion which was voted on and approved by all of the Trustees present.

Report on the Status of the Inquiry Regarding the Communication from Mr. James B. Franklin III, President of the Association of Black Students

Mr. Matthews announced that Mrs. Wilma Ray-Bledsoe has been diligently gathering evidence and testimony in connection with these matters. While significant information has been forthcoming, she indicates that it is much too early to draw any conclusions. Therefore, Mr. Matthews stated that there would be an interim report in July with a final report in October or November.

General Comments

Mr. Matthews informed the Board that Oakland University during the past three years has received personal and corporate contributions of over \$50,000 from the Ronald Bennett family. These funds have endowed an undergraduate chemistry scholarship and a graduate chemistry fellowship. The Alumni Relations office has received \$12,500 for the graduate fellowship endowment, and continues to work closely with the Bennett family in securing additional funds. Mr. Matthews added that there are now approximately 20,000 university alumni, some of whom graduated in 1963. He stated that a significant number of alumni have reached "economic, public and political maturity" and have become supporters of the university. He noted that about 8 alumni have joined the President's Club and he expressed the hope that the number would increase.

Mr. Matthews introduced Mr. Ronald Barr, Director of Alumni Relations, who has been working closely with the Bennett family. Mr. Matthews suggested that the gift be properly acknowledged by the university when the details on the contribution are concluded in July.

There being no further discussion, Mr. Richard Headlee moved that the meeting be adjourned. Mr. Alex Mair seconded the motion which was voted on and approved by all of the Trustees present. The meeting adjourned at 8:40 p.m.
