## SIGMA XI NATIONAL LECTURER TO OPEN GREAT LAKES TOUR HERE

Oakland University's Sigma Xi Club was selected to be host for the society's 1968-69 National Lecturer, Professor Daniel S. Lehrman of Rutgers University, who will speak today (Monday) on "Animal Reproductive Behavior Cycle" at 8 p.m. in 201 Dodge Hall. His appearance here will be the first in a tour of Great Lakes colleges, universities, and research laboratories.

Lehrman, who is a Research Career Awardee of the National Institute of Mental Health, has been on the faculty of Rutgers since 1950 and director of Rutgers' Institute of Animal Behavior since 1959. An abstract of his lecture is as follows: "The reproductive (migratory, territorial, sexual, parental) behavior of animals occurs mostly in annual cycles, and in shorter cycles within the annual cycle. The changes in behavior during the cycle are regulated in part by changes in endocrine condition, with consequent effects of the hormones upon the nervous system. Concurrently, external stimuli, which change in the course of the animal's activities, have an effect upon the endocrine system, acting through the nervous system's control of the endocrine glands. The changing behavior during the reproductive cycle is thus both the consequence of the effects of changing hormone conditions upon the nervous system, and of the effects of social and other external stimuli (through the nervous system) upon the endocrine system."

Lawrence Sullivan (university relations) left Thursday as a last-minute member of the volunteer force which is taking a convoy of six semi trailers full of donated goods to British Honduras. The convoy, arranged by the Michigan Partners of the Alliance and using vehicles and drivers supplied by Lansing Community College, will travel almost 8,000 miles round trip. The cargo includes clothing, school desks and books, farm machinery and supplies, and a variety of surplus hospital equipment. Sullivan is on loan for the 10-day trip to serve as a free-lance writer for the Detroit Free Press.
