- Center for Executive & Continuing Education

As we help our communities build thriving, sustainable businesses, we are helping to retain jobs as well as create new jobs to build a stronger Michigan economy.

To date we have two tenants in the incubator, one imminent and several others that we are considering.

Some incubators across the country specialize in only one business sector, but OU INC is characterized as a mixed-use incubator with emphasis in the technological areas of:

- Biotechnology and life sciences
- Information technology
- Alternative energy
- Manufacturing and advanced manufacturing, and
- Homeland defense and security

The OU SmartZone Business Incubator is targeting four specific client audiences:

Start up and emerging companies who will be tenants,

Affiliate member clients that will not be tenants but will directly benefit from commercialization services provided by the incubator,

Existing Michigan businesses that want to grow and spin off new intellectual property, and International companies that want to spin off new intellectual property in Michigan.
