Neville Marriner, Meadow Brook Artistic Director



Neville Marriner, world famous as the conductor and founder of the Academy of St. Martin-in-the-Fields, was recently named Artistic Director of the Minnesota Orchestra, and in the season of 1980-81 he will become a principal guest conductor of the Stuttgart Radio Symphony, one of Germany's top orchestras. He maintains in addition a kind of unofficial "permanent guest conductorship" of the Orchestre National in Paris, and fulfills numerous other guest engagements around the world. His summers are devoted to the artistic directorship of the Meadow Brook Music Festival at Oakland University in Rochester, Michigan, summer home of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, and to some major opera projects for other festivals in this country and abroad.

Marriner was born in Lincolnshire, a county of east central England, in 1924 and studied violin first with his father and then with local teachers. By winning a series of local competitions he was admitted to the Royal College of Music in London. After serving time in England's military service during World War II he studied with Rene Benedetti at the Paris Conservatoire and then returned to England, first to teach at Eton for a year and then to take up the life of a free-lance violinist in London. He either founded or was a member of such ensembles as the Martin String Quartet, the Virtuoso String Trio, and the Jacobean Ensemble. The latter had been established by Thurston Dart, a renowned authority on Baroque music performance practices, whose influence on Marriner was considerable. Eventually the two collaborated on several recordings, among them the historic version of the music Dart had made from manuscripts and other sources according to his strong belief that Bach had composed an earlier set of works somewhat different in scoring and other details from the version he finally presented to the Margrave of Brandenburg and which we know today as the Brandenburg Concerti.

In 1956 Marriner took a post as principal second violin with the London Symphony Orchestra, then in the process of a major reorganization. It soon turned into one of the finest ensembles in Europe, attracting many of the world's great conductors as guest artists, so that Marriner learned to know the major symphonic repertory under ideal and stimulating conditions. The late Pierre Monteux became the orchestra's permanent conductor in the course of Marriner's 13-year stay, and Marriner studied with him, both in London and later at his home in Maine.

Meanwhile Marriner and a group of friends had formed a 15-member ensemble which played concerts of Baroque music sheerly for the fun of it. They had been offered rehearsal space and a certain limited budget by one of London's historic parishes, St. Martin-in-the-Fields, and they took their performing name from that of the church (which is by no means "in the fields" but rather in Trafalgar Square), adding the collective noun "academy" to show that they were a small group of scholars and like-minded aficionados dedicated to a single purpose. The Academy of St. Martin-in-the-Fields gave its first concerts in the church and very soon became one of the most popular and highly esteemed of chamber ensembles.

His success with the Academy was so great, and his recordings with them so impressive, that in 1969 when the Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra was formed he was invited to become its conductor. Once again he was able to establish an enviable musical reputation for himself and his organization; in the new geographical setting his face became nearly as well known to Americans as his reputation, and he was called on to accept a growing number of invitations and repeat-invitations to guest conduct throughout the United States.

Marriner is one of the most recorded conductors in the history of music. More than 250 albums exist in his current discography (many of them with the Academy of St. Martin-in-the-Fields). The Schwann Catalogue announced recently that in the calendar year 1978 more recordings by Neville Marriner had been released — 29 in all — than by any other musician, classical or popular.

Some of his first were made for the small but prestigious label L'Oiseau-Lyre, founded by an Australian music lover, philanthropist and sheep farmer, Louise Dyer. Mrs. Dyer occasionally paid cash for the recording sessions, Marriner recalls, digging into her white handbag to produce clumps of crumpled five-pound notes. "We always said, when Louise wanted us to make another record she had to kill another sheep."

Opera is a new enthusiasm he wishes he had more time for. His *La Boheme* for Manchester and Sadler's Wells in London was a great success in 1977, as was his *Marriage of Figaro* at Aix-en-Provence in 1979.

Marriner and his wife Molly maintain apartments in both London and Minneapolis, and generally spend what free time they can find in his schedule at one of their English country homes, either a house in Lyme Regis — "Jane Austen country" — or Gosleford Cottage in Devonshire.

Marriner has been described as looking like an English choirboy. He is remarkably candid, totally unaffected in manner, and highly articulate on a number of subjects besides music, among them horse racing, which fascinates him so much that he always carries a special credit card with which he can bet on his favorites no matter where he happens to be conducting or rehearsing.

OAKLAND UNIVERSITY AND THE CHALLENGE OF THE 80's

Oakland University enters the 1980s in an enviable position.

The university continues to benefit from its geographic location. There is a strong population base, a beautiful suburban campus setting, and the job and cultural opportunities provided by a major metropolitan area.

There have been record enrollments each fall despite a declining high school population generally; and there have been new programs in response to changing needs of students and society.

Now there is another emphasis — a work experience — as a growing necessity for most students, regardless of major. Providing that opportunity is one institutional priority as the university begins a new decade.

Those work experiences come through a variety of options. They are provided through disciplines or under auspices of the Urban Affairs Center or the Center for Community and Human Development.

For example, the School of Nursing and the Medical Technology program have mandatory clinical experiences for their own majors, as does political science for its new master's program in public administration.

On a university-wide basis, Oakland County students or residents of the OU resident halls are eligible for a county internship program offered through Urban Affairs. Students continue their education and receive paid work opportunities in many county agencies. Some of the students have gone on to work for the county full-time following graduation. Some 210 students have been placed in this program since it began in the winter of 1976.


The Center for Community and Human Development now offers a


community service course for students in many disciplines. There are opportunities to develop competencies in a variety of areas. Students may assist in planning, development, or evaluation of agency systems and practices, or they may help evaluate client needs. In addition, the center has developed new co-op training programs in which pairs of students alternate in work and study situations.

During the winter semester 23 students participated in this new coop opportunity. The School of Engineering and the School of Economics and Management already have co-op programs administered through the Center. Other disciplines will follow.

The co-op opportunities currently are with GMC Truck and Coach, Burroughs Corporation, Detroit Bank Corporation, City National Bank, Parke-Davis, and the Social Security Administration.

Still another experience opportunity open to Oakland University students is career summer employment. This is available to students who have completed their junior year and register for assistance with the Career Advising and Placement Office. Frederick W. Obear, academic vice-president and provost, feels that,"The addition of cooperative education options to existing curricular alternatives which involve other job-related activities such as field terms, internships, clinicianships, and the like provides an exciting, new dimension to

Oakland's undergraduate program offerings. Particularly as students demonstrate their continued interest in combining academic work and job-related experiences, Oakland's work-study programs represent important opportunities for connecting the theoretical component of traditional classroom functions with the practical aspects that derive from the work setting."

Obear continued, "Our experiences to date indicate that students with such education and training are more successful in obtaining entry-level jobs. And, the marriage of knowledge and technique which occurs in such educational and employment environments provides the basis for an individual not only "to know" but to learn to apply that knowledge in useful ways, i.e., "to do."

"That outcome has always been compatible with Oakland University's mission," Obear said.


Venkat N. Reddy, director of The Institute of Biological Sciences, is the recipient of the Friedenwald Award of the Association for Research in Vision and Ophthalmology. The institute has won a grant from the National Eye Institute for a cooperative cataract research project with an eye hospital in India. In fiscal 1978-79 the university received \$1,883,567 from outside sources to support a variety of research activities, an all-time record. Many of these research projects are conducted with student aid. The opportunities for student research under the direction of, or in collaboration with a faculty member, are among the university's strengths.

CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

Diverse cultural activities attract thousands to campus each year. There are professional performances by the Meadow Brook Theatre that begins its 15th season next fall, there are the Detroit Symphony concerts and the jazz and pops series offered each summer by the Meadow Brook Music Festival. In addition, the On Stage series offers dance concerts, student theatre productions, and student and professional concert artists who will now appear under auspices of the restructured School of Performing Arts.

The Meadow Brook Art Gallery has won national acclaim for its exhibits. The gallery, located across from the Meadow Brook Theatre box office, is open evenings during theatre performances in order that theatre patrons can visit the gallery before the show and during intermissions.

GENERAL HISTORY

Oakland University, a medium-sized, state-supported coeducational institution, now offers more than 70 undergraduate majors and concentrations, and 27 graduate programs including Ph.D. programs in systems engineering and reading. Academic offerings range from liberal arts courses in Oakland's College of Arts and Sciences to preprofessional studies in economics and management, education, engineering, and nursing, and health sciences, among others. Exceptional students in any discipline can apply to the Honors College of the College of Arts and Sciences. Degrees may also be pursued through the Center for General and Career Studies and the Center for Health Sciences.

The university was founded in 1957 when the late Matilda R. and Alfred G. Wilson donated their Meadow Brook Farms Estate and \$2,000,000 to Michigan State University to build a new university in Oakland County.

Today Meadow Brook Hall, the Wilson's 100-room-Tudor-style mansion, is a successful conference and cultural center.

OU received its independence and its own board of trustees in 1970.

ENROLLMENT

The OU student body has grown from 570 students to a record 11,729 full and part-time students. More than 90 percent of each entering class comes from the tri-county area of Oakland, Wayne, and Macomb counties.

FACULTY

The university faculty now numbers nearly 450, and 78 percent of the full-time instructors hold doctorates in specialized fields. Many of the instructional staff have been singled out for various awards from such institutions as the American Council for Learned Societies, the National Science Foundation, and the Fullbright-Hays Fellowship. Franklin Sayre, art and art history, has won a teaching fellowship to Harvard, and Beverly R. Burger, physics, has won a fellowship to the Institute for Theoretical Physics at the University of California, Santa Barbara.

CONTINUING EDUCATION

Each department within the Division of Continuing Education is designed to help people perform more effectively in their roles as workers, parents, and citizens.

The Conference Department designs conferences, institutes, and seminars on a variety of subjects in response to community interest and needs. The Continuum Center offers counseling services and leadership training opportunities to individuals and organizations, and it has gained national recognition for work with older citizens. The center assists people of all ages in the meaningful evaluation and planning of their lives. The Course Department offers evening nondegree diploma programs and courses in professional, vocational, and cultural subjects on campus. Preparatory courses for the C.P.A. licensing examination are also offered. The Labor Education Service provides residential institutes and daytime and evening courses at on- and off-campus locations for union members.

ATHLETICS

Oakland University offers a strong program of intercollegiate athletics for men and women. Teams compete for league championships in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC). This winter the men's swimming team won the NCAA Division II Championship. Helen Shereda, of the women's basketball team, became the school's first All-American in that sport.

The 1980-81 season marks the sixty-seventh in the Detroit Symphony Orchestra's illustrious history. During this time it has become firmly established among the foremost musical organizations of the world and has won highest critical acclaim wherever it has appeared. The Orchestra continues to distinguish itself through extensive tours — including its dramatically successful premiere tour of Europe, in November of 1979 — and a new series of recordings, on the London label.

The DSO has a normal performing complement of 100 musicians. Each season the Orchestra presents more than 200 concerts, including over 80 regular subscription concerts and a number of special concerts in its home, Ford Auditorium. A series of Young People's Concerts and school concerts are also given annually both at Ford Auditorium and in Detroit schools. Free concerts are offered each summer at various sites in and around Detroit, and the Orchestra regularly plays in cities all over both peninsulas of the State of Michigan.

The Meadow Brook Music Festival at Oakland University is the summer home of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra. Situated in northern Oakland County, where a special ampitheatre was built for the Orchestra. Meadow Brook has established itself as one of the major summer music festivals in the nation.

Under music director Antal Dorati, the Detroit Symphony Orchestra has expanded activities in several areas, including national and international touring, recordings, establishment of an annual mid-season festival, continuation of weekly statewide radio broadcasts, and continued growth of state-wide projects.

Maestro Dorati's leadership of the Detroit Symphony has propelled this ensemble into international prominence following a dramatically successful European tour in the fall of 1979. This premiere tour of Europe for the Detroit Symphony captivated audiences and critics in 23 European cities.

The Meadow Brook Festival Women's Committee Story

In the summer of 1977, Mrs. John C. Secrest who with her husband chaired the Meadow Brook Festival Executive Committee that year, Mrs. Francis A. Engelhardt, and a member of the Meadow Brook Music Festival staff attended a Conference for Women Volunteers of Major Music Festivals in the United States at the Blossom Music Center in Ohio. It was an exciting experience and the group returned determined to revamp the Meadow Brook Festival Women's Committee.

Prior to that time the Women's Committee had consisted of several hundred women whose major responsibilities had been to distribute promotional materials and to sell coupon books. Valuable as this service was to the Meadow Brook Festival management, it lacked the rewards usually associated with volunteer activities. The decision was made to organize a "working committee" smaller in number but one whose members would be actively involved in projects which would further the goals of the Festival.

In the fall of 1977, twelve women met at the home of Mrs. Richard A. Vining who with her husband chaired the Meadow Brook Festival Executive Committee in 1978. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the organization and direction of the new committee. A membership meeting was planned for January 1978 and from these small beginnings an enthusiastic and dedicated group evolved.

Bylaws were adopted in 1978. As a major fund raiser the Committee designed a Meadow Brook Music Festival blanket that was sold on the festival grounds from a cart built by the husband of one of the members.

During the 1978 festival season the Women's Committee hosted the Second Annual Conference for Volunteers of Major Music Festivals; a luncheon and concert by the Musica Aeterna Chamber Orchestra; and a party honoring members of the Junior Women's Association

for the Detroit Symphony Orchestra and their husbands who served as ushers for the concerts.

Five delegates from the Women's Committee attended the Third Annual Conference for Volunteers of Major Music Festivals at the Saratoga Performing Arts Center in Saratoga, New York in July 1979.

Also in 1979, plans to open a gift shop on Trumbull Terrace became a reality. The shop, called The Treble Clef, was staffed by members and their husbands. In addition to the blankets, umbrellas, tote bags, T-shirts, stationery, and an award winning Meadow Brook Festival poster were sold.

A matinee of "4 Girls 4" sponsored by the Women's Committee as a fund raiser, in August 1979, was followed by a reception, on stage, to meet the popular performers.

A Yearbook was compiled and distributed at the October 1979 meeting.

In May 1980, Mrs. Bennett Bidwell who with her husband chaired the 1979 Meadow Brook Festival Executive Committee, arranged a beautiful membership tea at which concert pianist, Flavio Varani, presented a program.

THE KRESGE FOUNDATION

The Meadow Brook Executive Committee expresses its appreciation to one of its most important benefactors, The Kresge Foundation. In 1964 when the Festival was a dream, The Kresge Foundation made a \$76,000 gift to the capital fund in memory of civic leader and foundation trustee, Howard C. Baldwin. The Pavilion is named in his honor. A second gift of \$50,000 a year later made possible the permanent seating in the Pavilion. Subsequently, the Foundation provided an additional capital grant of \$33,000 to improve the Festival's performing capabilities. The gift added dressing rooms below stage, new electrical circuits, a sound reinforcement system for the popular programs, and new restroom facilities. Most recently, the Foundation provided a grant of \$145,000 for renovation and expansion of the Festival's facilities.
