Wind Hard Got Wrought


The Commission on Student Life was elected last spring for the ostensible purpose of reducing the numerous ambiguities in the relationship between student organizations and the administration. The final results of this hoped for reorganization may be viewed in the Oakland center. Alas, upon viewing the soon to be implemented scheme of organization, we are left with a feeling of greater confusion about the role and purpose of student organizations at Oakland than before the Commission undertook to bring some order to the scene.

Where once there was SACC, Commuter Council, Dorm Council, Library Comm., Circle K, and the rest of the mamerous student groups drifting about in limbo, we now have a tripartate Student Activities Board with thirteen mambers which is responsible in one or the other of its three natures for the allocation of monies to various organizations and to plan events other clubs or organizations are not planning. The execution of these previously unknown events would be through awarding a contract through a system of bids to one club or another. Apparently from the new scheme Commuter Council, Dorm Council are still drifting about with independent financial authority intact. While in place of SACC we have a 13 member three part committee organized in such a manner to make internal squabbling endemic.

The Commission on Student Life, meanwhile has voted to become self perpetuating. Thus once more proving the bureaucratic adage: OLD COMMISSIONS NEVER DIE AND RARELY FADE AWAY. We seriously question the need for the maintainence of yet another committee at this institution in a perios where the whole university seems to be organized into a wider

variety of committees than a Balkan politburo.

What has occurred as a result of last springs agitation for better organization is approximately the opposite from what was hoped for. Instead of actual coherent reorganization the commission has actually erected yet another independent bureaucratic system which will soon be released to go spinning off into limbe among all the other autonomous bodies already wheeling about and going nowhere rapidly.
