


South Foundation Hall

- **South Foundation Hall is closed and being prepared for construction.**
- **The \$40M total project cost includes \$30M in Michigan Capital Outlay funds.**
- **Construction includes renovation of 55,000 square feet and addition of 25,000 square feet designated for classes to teach STEM, health sciences, education, humanities and the arts.**



Bachelor's Degrees Awarded

- In 2019-2020, OU awarded a record 3,563 bachelor's degrees
- Top 3 degrees awarded:
 - Nursing
 - Mechanical Engineering
 - Psychology



Frontline Workers Scholarship



- Award is an extension of the governor's Futures for Frontliners initiative
- Supports workers on the frontline of the COVID-19 pandemic who earned their associate's degree (from a state community college) and are pursuing their bachelor's degree.
- Eligible students will receive \$2,500 over two years (\$1,250/year or \$625 per semester)
- Scholarship supports OU's mission and the Governor's postsecondary degree attainment goal of 60% by 2030.
- OU has received responses from many of the state's 28 community colleges





Student Success

- **Peyton Schmid awarded** \$10,000 scholarship for leadership in engineering. She is one of only 10 students worldwide to receive a 2020 Ford Alan Mulally Leadership in Engineering Scholarship.
- **Allison Broski** was recognized for the leading of the 1st Virtual Hackathon
- **Hanna Rau** - President of the Formula SAE Team assisted with producing over 500 face shields which was donated to our local hospitals
- **Mariama Toure** and HTech mentor **Rachel Jackson** were recognized for this year 2021 Keeper of the Dream Scholarship
- **HTech Transfer Student program** - Provides weekly peer to peer mentoring and one-on-one tutoring to any underrepresented or underserved transfer student studying in the areas of STEM.
 - 4 of 12 students who participate in the program received a 4.0 GPA last semester

25 Best Master's in Mechanical Engineering 2020



We ranked the top 25 colleges that offer a Master's Degree in Mechanical Engineering based on the median salary of this program's graduates one year after completion. The school with the highest median salary for this degree is Massachusetts Institute of Technology, at \$108,700. Texas A&M University-College Station offers the lowest median debt on the list, at \$19,454. Students who graduated with a Master's Degree in Mechanical Engineering from one of the top 25 schools had a median starting salary between \$77,800 and \$108,700.

These are the best 25 colleges that offer a Bachelor's Degree in Mechanical Engineering, based on median salary one year after graduation. The top ranked school is SUNY Maritime College, with a median salary of \$82,800. The school with the lowest median debt for this degree is Duke University, with a debt of \$10,080. The rest of the schools on the list boast median starting salaries in the \$70,300-\$82,800 range for students who graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Mechanical Engineering.

We ranked the top 25 schools by median salary one year after college for students who graduate with a Bachelor's Degree in Electrical Engineering. The top ranked school on this list is Massachusetts Institute of Technology, at a median salary of \$116,600 and a median debt of \$13,733. University of California - Berkeley also offers a starting salary of \$116,600, but has a slightly higher median debt of \$14,347. Cornell's median student debt is \$12,445, the lowest of the schools ranked on this list. Schools on the list boast median starting salaries in the \$72,300-\$116,600 range.





Workplace Diversity - Ensuring the hiring of women and minorities to continue to thrive in innovation, decision making, and make certain of opportunities for underrepresented students.




Engineering Female Enrollment


