The Oakland University Board of Trustees will meet Monday, Sept. 24, at 8:00 p.m. in the Gold Room of the Oakland Center. The University Senate will meet Wednesday, Sept. 19, from 3:15 p.m. in Rooms 128-130 of the Oakland Center.

LATIN AMERICAN FILM FESTIVAL OPENS

Oakland University will present a Bolivian film, "Blood of the Condor," on Monday, Sept. 24, as the first offering in a Sept. 24 through Nov. 26 Latin American film festival. Guest lecturers will follow presentation of each film.

"Blood of the Condor" will be shown at 12:30 p.m. in the Gold Room of the Oakland Center and again at 7:30 p.m. in Room 201, Dodge Hall of Engineering. Dennis Olkowski, Peace Corps and VISTA (Volunteers in Service to America) communications director for Michigan and Indiana, will speak following the film. "Blood of the Condor" has won three international awards. It traces the exploitation of the Bolivian Indians by foreign and indigenous minorities.

The festival is sponsored by the Departments of Area Studies and Modern Languages and it is designed to make people more aware of the social, economic, and political conditions in Latin America today. The festival will also show the advances in cinematography made in those countries.

Oct. 22-12:30 p.m., Gold Room, Oakland Center and 7:30 p.m., Room 201, Dodge Hall, "Harvest of Shame." A CBS documentary on the conditions faced by Mexican-American farm laborers. English.

Oct. 26-12:30 and 7:30 p.m., Gold Room, Oakland Center, "Yo soy Chicano." A series of interviews and dramatic reenactments about what it means to be a Mexican-American. English sub-titles.

Nov. 7-12:30 p.m., Gold Room, Oakland Center and 7:30 p.m., Room 201, Dodge Hall, "Mexico: the Frozen Revolution." Winner of five international awards--A graphic delineation of the political reality of Mexican history. English sub-titles.

FALL WEEKEND INCLUDES CARNIVAL AND CONCERT

Oakland University will hold its "Fall Weekend" celebration for the OU community and the public on Friday, Sept. 21 through Sunday, Sept. 23. A carnival with rides and games and a concert by the Ike and Tina Turner Review highlight the

activities.

The carnival will be held in parking lot M directly behind Vandenberg Hall at the following times: from 6:00 p.m. until midnight on Sept. 21; from noon until midnight on Sept. 22; and from noon until 6:00 p.m. on Sept. 23.

The Sept. 23 concert with the Ike and Tina Turner Review will conclude the three-day program. Concert time is 7:00 p.m. in Baldwin Memorial Pavilion. Tickets are priced to the public at \$3.75, \$4.50, and \$5.75 for pavilion seats and at \$3.00 for lawn seats. Tickets will be sold at the Student Organization's box office in the Oakland Center and in the Pavilion box office the night of the concert.

The University Programming Committee and the Concert Lecture Series Committee are co-sponsors for the weekend.

The Studio Company of the Academy of Dramatic Art will open a six-play 1973-74 season on Oct. 5 with "Look Homeward Angel". The Ketti Frings' dramatization of the Thomas Wolfe novel will be repeated Oct. 6-7 and Oct. 11 through Oct. 14.

All performances are in the Studio Theatre of Varner Hall. They are 6:30 p.m. Sunday curtains and 8:15 p.m. starting times Mondays through Saturdays.

The remaining plays includes Shakespeare's "Richard III" set for Nov. 30, Dec. 1, 2, 6, 7, 8, 9, 13, 14, 15; William Wycherly's "The Country Wife" on Feb. 1, 2, 3, 7, 8, 9, 10; and Anton Chekhov's "The Three Sisters" will be presented on March 7, 8, 9, 14, 15, 16, 17. A double bill, Arthur Schnitzler's "The Green Cockatoo," and Eugene O'Neill's "The Long Voyage Home," will close the season with performances slated for April 12, 13, 14, 18, 19, 20, 21.
