BROWN LEAVES; OFFICES REORGANIZED

Glen Brown, Assistant President for Campus Development, has resigned effective August I to become executive vice president for Robert D. Beard, Inc., of Fort Wayne, Indiana.

Brown had been responsible for the campus development program since 1971 and prior to that had been director of admissions for nine years.

President O'Dowd has announced that the campus development operation will be assigned administratively to Kenneth H. Coffman, vice president for student affairs, effective August I.

O'Dowd also announced the reassignment of the departments that had comprised the division of administrative affairs. Admissions, financial aid, registrar, and institutional research become part of the Division of Academic Affairs, while the business office assumes responsibility for Employment Relations and the Computing Center. These changes are effective immediately.

Covert was director of security for Meadow Brook Hall. His wife, Nancy, is a long-time university employee and has recently been appointed assistant to the dean of the School of Nursing.

NEW PROGRAMS APPROVED BY BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The establishment of a new Career Development Program was approved by the Oakland University Board of Trustees at its monthly meeting on June 25, and a faculty council was authorized to give

direction to the program. Under the Career Development Program, holders of associate degrees in science from community and junior colleges may be admitted to the university as candidates for the Bachelor of General Studies degree without loss of any credits, to a total of 62 credits. Starting in fall, 1975, the program will admit applicants from the general fields of technology studies, business studies, and labor.

The board further approved the establishment of a Bachelor of General Studies Degree Program, an unstructured, non major degree with minimal residence requirements. Academic-administrative arrangements to develop the program will be presided over by the Faculty Council for General Studies.

The board also approved a recommendation by the University Senate that completion of a minimum of 32 credit hours of work at the 300 level or above be required for a baccalaureate degree, approved new policies relating to the awarding of two baccalaureate degrees to a single student, and approved a new Bachelor of Science degree program in Applied Management.
