## FIFTH SEASON OF MEADOW BROOK OPENS THIS WEEK

Meadow Brook Theatre will open its fifth season this week with a production of Thornton Wilder's Skin of Our Teeth. Considered one of the greatest plays of our time, the production will star Harry Ellerbe as Antrobus and Elisabeth Orion as his wife. Terence Kilburn, artistic director of Meadow Brook and the Academy of Dramatic Art, will direct the play.

The season opener will be Thursday, with a curtain time of 8:30 p.m. The play will continue in the campus theatre through Nov. 22 and then will move to the Detroit Institute of Arts Theatre for a one-week run, Nov. 25-29. Tickets for all performances are available at the box office, ext. 2305.

TURMOIL IN ISRAEL

"Transformations in a Revolutionary Society: The Case of Israel" will be the topic of Prof. S. N. Eisenstadt of Hebrew University, Jerusalem, in a lecture at 8 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 5, in the Gold Room. His appearance here is under the sponsorship of the sociology and anthropology department. Eisenstadt, a visiting professor at the University of Michigan, is regarded as the first sociologist to address himself systematically to the problem which became known later as the "Generation Gap." Sociology chairman Nahum Medalia called him "an expert on youth society, sociology of intellectuals, political sociology, and comparative social institutions."

ORCHESTRA TO PERFORM

The University Orchestra, under the direction of David Daniels, will present its first concert of the season Thursday at 8 p.m. in 110 Performing Arts. Works on the program will include "La Creation du Monde" by Darius Milhaud, Overture to "Idomeneo" by Mozart, and Symphony in C major by Bizet.

He will speak at 2 p.m. Tuesday in The Abstention on "The Future of Integration and Separatism in the U.S."
