OUWB medical students at Gary Burnstein Clinic

On the first Thursday of every month from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., Oakland University William Beaumont School of Medicine (OUWB) students hold a free health clinic at the Gary Burnstein Community Health Clinic.



Any Oakland County resident who does not have insurance, is below the poverty line and is between the

ages of 18-65 is eligible for free treatment at the clinic. These age limits are set because children younger than 18 are covered by Michigan's MIChild health insurance program, while people over 65 are covered by Medicare.

The clinic is run entirely by first- through fourth-year medical students and overseen by physician faculty, according to Allen Nelson, an OUWB student and director of the OUWB Student Run Free Clinic.

When the clinic is open, there are 14 OUWB students working at a time: three in triage, three in pharmacy and four sets of two-student exam teams. OUWB students can volunteer at the clinic once every three months.

Other key personnel include Dr. Neila Alfonso, the clinic care director, director of in-prep practice of medicine and assistant dean for community integration and outreach for WB. Nelson said that David Rogers, advisor of the Family Medicine Interest Group, was also integral to getting the clinic started.

When asked about his goals for the program's future, Nelson said he wants to continue establishing the relationship with the clinic and the local community.

"We hope to open up additional clinic times and we want to have additional rotation sites," he added.

The Gary Burnstein Community Health Clinic is located at 45580 Woodward Avenue in Pontiac.
