Eight engineering professors win grants

Eight researchers at Oakland University's **School of Engineering and Computer Science** (SECS) have won grants from different organizations.

Professor Ka C Cheok received \$58,220 from DaimlerChrysler Challenge Fund for his research on "Vehicle Control and Performance Modeling."

Professors Robert P. Van Til, Michael A. Latcha, Ronald J. Srodawa and Sankar Sengupta received a \$53,859 award from the National Science Foundation for their project entitled "Robotic Assembly Cell."

Professor Mohamed A. Zohdy was awarded \$40,000 by the University of Cairo for his project "Computer-Aided Control of Metallic Industry."

Professors Laila Guessous and Qingchong Liu received \$7,500 each by the University Research Committee for a research fellowship.
