

OU pre-med concentration welcomes science and non-science majors

A successful career in medicine can be based on three things: a love for learning, a true intellectual curiosity about medicine and a strong desire to help others, writes Carl Bianco, MD, in How Becoming a Doctor Works. Bianco, an emergency physician, says there are no required majors for acceptance into medical school, though the most common is biology. "OU's pre-medical concentration—previously called pre-professional—identifies a group of courses that are required and/or recommended as preparation for medical school," says Kathleen Moore, associate dean of OU's College of Arts and Sciences and professor of chemistry.
