And, for our Polish friends with us today: Witamy na Oakland University.

This morning we are honored to welcome the President of the United States and the President of Poland, other dignitaries, and members of the Polish community to our beautiful campus in northern Oakland County, Michigan.

It is the first time a sitting president from any country has visited our campus in an official capacity.
