Robert Griffin, Congressman from Michigan's 9th District, has disclosed that \$ 1,864,389 is now available for national student loans in Michigan.

Under the National Defense Student Loan Program, needy students who are qualified may borrow funds at low interest rates to help finance their college education.

According to Congressman Griffin, approximately \$72,174 will be available to MSUO for student loans during the 1960-61 school year. For further information about qualifications and forms of application you should see Dean Alexander.
