OU TOPS UNITED FUND DRIVE GOAL

Oakland University personnel contributed more than \$12,500 to the United Fund Drive exceeding the \$10,663 goal set for the campus, Lowell Ruggles, campus drive coordinator said. He paid tribute to the people who contributed and to 60 campus volunteers

who helped in the fund collection.

OC WILL ACCEPT MONEY FOR HAWKES FUND The Oakland Center operations office, Room II2, is serving as the collection center for funds raised for Department of Public Safety officer Orie Hawkes and his family.

Bill Marshall, director of the OC, suggests that interested persons pass around a collection envelope in their office, on their floor or among their friends. Any money or checks collected should be turned over to Marshall or Augustine Wright in Room II2.

Hawkes' wife Jacqueline was murdered Dec. 2 in Detroit. The fund campaign is an effort to relieve some of the financial burden that is a result of this tragedy.

ELECTIONS UNDERWAY FOR TENURE COMMITTEE Two openings on the University Tenure and Appointment Policy Committee have been filled by faculty vote and three more positions on the I8-member committee are being decided.

Fredrick W. Obear, academic vice president and provost, said Charles Akers, history, has been elected to an at large seat to fill the unexpired term of Clifford Harding, biological sciences. Harding's term expires Dec. 31, 1975.

Eleutherios Botsas was elected by the faculty of the School of Economics and Management to a three-year term ending Dec. 31, 1976. Still to be decided are two at large seats to replace Edward Heubel, history, and Keith Kleckner, engineering, and a replacement in the College of Arts and Sciences for a seat held by Robert Williamson, physics. The terms will all expire on Dec. 31, 1976.

BASKETBALL GAMES BROADCAST OVER WPON Eleven Oakland University basketball games are being carried this season over WPON radio. The home and away contests will be preceded by a 10 minute pregame show. The setting is 1460 on the AM dial.

Corey VanFleet, director of physical education and athletics, expressed gratitude to the sponsors who have contributed to an "athletic first" at OU. "We appreciate their support and we feel this is an important recognition of our athletic program," he said. OU was 5-0 going into last weekend's competition.

REGISTRATION IS JAN. 3-4 MOST STUDENTS PREREGISTERED

More than 80 percent of Oakland University's regular campus students took advantage of early registration for the 1973-74 winter term, Register Lowell Ruggles reports. No attempts were made to preregister the off-campus programs and exclusively even-

ing students, he said.

Registration periods: Remaining day undergraduates and graduates, Thursday, Jan. 3, and Friday, Jan. 4, from 8:30 a.m. to II:00 a.m. and from I:00 p.m. to 3:45 p.m.; registration for exclusively evening students, Jan. 3-4 and Monday, Jan. 7 through Wednesday, Jan. 9, from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.; and registration for evening graduate students, Monday, Jan. I4, through Thursday, Jan. I7 from 5:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. All the above sessions will be held in the Offices of the Registrar.

SENATE DEFEATS GOVERNANCE SYSTEM

The University Senate voted down a new governance system as an amendment to the constitution of Oakland University and of the Oakland University Senate. The proposal would have replaced existing bodies such as the University Senate, the students'

University Congress, and the Assembly of the Administrative-Professional with a single recommending body. Members of the central administration would have been excluded.

In other action, the Senate voted down a grade conversion scheme proposed by the Academic Policy Committee after APC proposers of the motion recommended its defeat. The Senate was informed that student objections to an earlier conversion scheme adopted by the Senate last April had been resolved, and that the new scheme should now be defeated.

The defeated motion would have converted 3.0 to 3.4 grades to a B and 3.5 to 4.0 grades to an A. Remaining in use is the Senate's April 5, 1973 approved conversion scheme. In it, 1.0 to 1.9 converts to D; 2.0 to 2.9 converts to C; 3.0 to 3.5 converts to B; and marks of 3.6 to 4.0 are A grades.
