Nominations sought for Googasian Award

The award, given annually since 1992, honors an outstanding woman leader who has demonstrated commitment to the advancement of women on campus through distinguished leadership, scholarship, advocacy, mentoring, program development or other activities.

Any member of the OU faculty, including special instructors and lecturers, and administrative professionals or other staff, is eligible for the award. Nominations are welcome from any university employee. The Googasian Award Committee ranks nominees according to established criteria and selects a winner.

Nomination forms recently were distributed through on-campus mail, and must be returned to Mary Papazian, associate dean of the College of Arts and Sciences and chair of the Googasian Award Committee, by Friday, Jan. 17.
