On March 31, 2016, the Center for Autism and the Department of Human Development and Child Studies hosted a symposium titled, *Autism and Sexuality: Challenges and Hidden Dangers*. The purpose of the symposium was to increase awareness of the topic of sexuality for adolescents and adults with autism and the legalities of sexual behavior. More than 240 participants, including social workers, counselors, attorneys, mental health workers, judges, parents, and individuals with autism, attended the conference held in the Golf Pavilion at Oakland University.



Dr. Isabelle Henault, internationally renowned researcher on this topic, spoke in the morning and engaged the audience with her personal stories as a psychologist, therapist, and researcher in the field of sexuality and Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD). In the afternoon, Dr. Gary Mesibov, emeritus professor from University of North Carolina, and Mr. Raymond Cassar, Attorney at Law, discussed autism and the criminal justice system. The last two speakers, Mr. Larry Dubin and Ms. Kitty Dubin, gave compelling talks as to the life of their son, Nick, a young man with Asperger Syndrome, and his involvement in the criminal justice system. The day concluded with a panel discussion and questions from the audience. The faculty within the Center for Autism look forward to continuing the education and discussion of sexuality and autism and increasing awareness of this topic, especially to those in the legal community.




SMEA Holds Family Fun Fair
