

26th Annual Reading Recovery Council of Michigan Institute

On November 16–17, over 300 administrators, Reading Recovery, Literacy Lessons, and Literacy Support educators from across the state came together for the 26th annual Reading Recovery Council of Michigan Institute, held at The Somerset Inn in Troy, Michigan. The premier Institute theme was Reading Recovery® and Literacy Lessons™: Doors to a Literate Future. Dean Jon Margerum-Leys welcomed the Institute participants Thursday morning. The morning included the presentation of RRCM awards to Dawn Conner, Deputy Superintendent of Dowagiac Union Schools and Jennifer Allen, Director of State/Federal Programs & Grants, Port Huron Schools in recognition of their commitment to Reading Recovery in their schools.

This year's Institute featured nationally renowned authors and keynote speakers: Dr. Peter Johnston from the University at Albany - SUNY and Dr. James Schnug from Ohio State University as well as eight other nationally recognized featured presenters including Dr. Mary Lose. The presenters and the professional learning inspired the efforts of all who attended to transform the lives of our most at-risk learners, opening doors to the students' literate futures.
