OU pre-med concentration welcomes science and non-science majors

Bianco, an emergency physician, says there are no required majors for acceptance into medical school, though the most common is biology. "OU's pre-medical concentration — previously called pre-professional — identifies a group of courses that are required and/or recommended as preparation for medical school," says Kathleen Moore, associate dean of OUs College of Arts and Sciences and professor of chemistry.
