MEADOW BROOK FEATURES CONDUCTORS, JAZZ TRUMPETER

A week of contrasting programs at Meadow Brook will offer the Meadow Brook Festival debut of noted conductor Stanislaw Skrowaczewski, jazz trumpeter, Al Hirt, and Morton Gould will be among featured artists July 18 through July 21. Skrowaczewski, principal conductor and music director of the Minnesota Orchestra, conducts Thursday and Saturday evenings, July 18 and 20, at 8:30. Pianist, Eugene Istomin will be guest artist both nights.

Hirt will take center stage Friday, July 19, at 8:30.

On Sunday, Gould will highlight his own works and those of other American composers in an evening of pops starting at 6:30. The program will include Copland's "Billy the Kid," and Turok's "Joplin Overture," as well as Gould's "Fall River Legend" Ballet Suite. Featured will be Mr. Gould's unique "Tap Dance Concerto," performed by dancer-choreographer Michael Dominico, in an exciting first at Meadow Brook.

STUDENT LIFE SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS NAMED FOR 1974-75

One hundred and ten freshman and transfer students have been awarded Student Life Scholarships for the 1974-75 year, Edward J. Bagale, associate director of admissions and scholarships, has announced.

The renewable rewards apply towards students' residence hall living costs. The recipients are chosen on the basis of outstanding scholarship and on service to their high schools or community colleges and to their communities. "Their contributions to their schools have been significant and I am confident that these scholarship winners will continue to have a very positive influence on student life programs at OU," Bagale said.

The award recipients represent 79 secondary schools and three community colleges. Fifty of the institutions are in the tri-county area of Oakland, Macomb and Wayne, and the other 32 are out-of-state schools, Bagale said.

SEALED BIDS FOR OU'S NEW BUILDING DUE AUG. 1

Sealed bids for architectural, mechanical and electrical work on a new Oakland University Public Safety and Services Building are due by 2:00 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 1, in the office of President Donald D. O'Dowd.

Construction on the 24,500 square foot facility should begin sometime in August, OU officials said. The building will be located north of the Belgian Barn area and its three main occupants will be Public Safety, University Services and the mechanical, electrical and structural services offices of the Physical Plant.
