GREENE NAMED EQUAL OPPORTUNITY MANAGER

Walter R. Greene, III has been named equal opportunity manager in the Office of Employment Relations, Carl Westman, the office director, has announced.

The position has already been approved by the board and Greene's appointment is effective immediately, Westman said. Greene will administer OU's affirmative action hiring program.

The 27-year-old Greene comes to OU from Chrysler Corporation headquarters in Highland Park where for the past year he has been employment and placement coordinator. He worked for two years as assistant director of student financial aid at the University of Detroit and in a similar position for one year at Wayne State University.

He attended Pennsylvania Military College in Chester, P.A., and he received his B.A. degree in economics from the University of Michigan in 1971. He has done graduate study in personnel and industrial relations at the University of Detroit. Greene has served as a member of the Detroit Commission on Community Relations and he was the first Chairman of its Education Committee. He serves as Treasurer of the Detroit Chapter of the Friends of Amistad, an organization in support of the Amistad Research Center on the campus of Dillard University in New Orleans. Greene is a native of Detroit and he resides at 17544 Sussex.

The Saturday, May 18, program will be held at 6:15 p.m. in the Southfield Ice Arena in the Civic Center Complex (Evergreen between 10 and 11 Mile Roads).

The dance performed will be "La Farruca," a classical Spanish flamenco dance. The festival runs from the 17th to the 19th of May.
