Polish culture on exhibit

An exhibition of photographs and prints portraying more than one thousand years of Polish culture will be on display in the Oakland Center September 10-18.

The exhibition, entitled "The Panorama of Contemporary Polish Culture," shows a proud cultural tradition which featured a high level of civilization with numerous Romanesque buildings as early as the 10th century A.D. It is open to the viewing public at no charge whenever the building is open. Call 377-2020 for additional information.

This display traces the development of that culture through the years, despite invasions by Tartars (13th century), Swedes and Cossacks (17th century), and Nazis (20th century), each time followed by a cultural renewal and renaissance. Featured amongst the many items on

display are such notable achievements as the establishment of Jagiellonian University in 1364, the construction of the famous Wawel Cathedral, and more recently, the eradication of illiteracy and the many Polish contributions to literature, theater, film music, and art.

The exhibition appears courtesy of the Polish Consulate in Chicago in conjunction with various Detroit area groups. Portions of the display appeared earlier this summer at the Hart Plaza during the Ethnic Festival. The Oakland University presentation is sponsored by the CIPO office in conjunction with the Oakland Center.

"In addition, the display will feature many special items from the collection of Dr. Zofia Kafarski of Bloomfield Hills, who has been instrumental in arranging the exhibit."

Sheila Tobias, author of *Overcoming Math Anxiety*, who is introducing the Division of Continuing Education's new Math Competency Diploma Program, will meet with two university groups Tuesday, Sept. 11.

Tobias, math anxiety consultant and former associate provost at Wesleyan University, will address the Oakland University Women's Studies Faculty from 3 to 4:30 p.m. in Gold Room C of the Oakland Center. An informal buffet for Ms. Tobias with university faculty will follow from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. in Lounge Two of the Oakland Center.

At 8 p.m. Ms. Tobias will share some insights to overcoming math anxiety and math avoidance behavior at a public meeting scheduled to preview the Division of Continuing Education's first offerings in the new Math Competency Diploma Program: "You Can Overcome

Math Anxiety or Avoidance—A Workshop," to begin Wednesday, Sept. 19, and "On Your Way To Becoming Math Competent," beginning Wednesday, Oct. 24. Both are five-week nondegree courses. Labor Bulletin

Summaries of tentative agreement between OU and the OU Chapter of the American Association of University Professors are being distributed to the membership. Representatives of both parties are meeting this week to iron out final language of the agreement. The final contract will be typed and distributed to the membership prior to a ratification vote. The entire process is expected to take at least three to four weeks.

The UAW Clerical Technical Local 1925 will meet at noon on Friday, Sept. 8, to vote on ratification of a new contract. A site for the vote is being selected.

Both labor contracts must be approved by the Board of Trustees.

Brochures detailing job related and avocational nondegree courses for the fall semester are available in the Division of Continuing Education in room 265, SFH. The classes begin the week of Sept. 17. Full-time faculty, staff, students and spouses can enroll for half tuition in any course that has met the minimum enrollment requirements.

Fall sports deserve support

The Oakland University athletic department is hoping for another successful fall sports season as the men's soccer and cross country teams hit the field and the women's tennis and volleyball take to the courts.

Second-year soccer coach Wayne Pirmann hopes to improve on last year's 8-5-2 mark, while Steve Hebold, OU's cross country mentor, has his sights set on improving last season's 5-2 dual meet mark. First-year tennis coach Brad Newman hopes to win the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) tennis crown after placing second last fall. The women netters won 15 of 17 matches with both losses coming from Wayne State University by 5-4 scores. The women spikers, under the direction of coach Jan Peters, are determined to better last year's 14-6 mark.

OU students with their ID cards will be admitted free to all athletic contests. The general public will be charged \$2 for adults and \$1 for students, while the Pioneer Pass for all faculty, staff, and alumni members will cost \$15. Admission will be charged for the following sports: soccer, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's swimming, women's volleyball, and wrestling.

Oakland University Ordinance No. 10

An ordinance to amend Oakland University Ordinance No. 1, known as the Public Safety Ordinance, by supplementing the provisions thereof relating to Campus Regulations, Traffic Regulations, Lost Property, and Impounded Vehicles.

The Board of Trustees of Oakland University ordains.

Oakland University Ordinance No. 1 is hereby amended by adding thereto new Sections 5.15 and 5.16, and by modifying Sections 5.10 and 8.01, to read as follows:

5.10 In a civil infraction action for the violation of this ordinance relating to the parking of a vehicle, proof that the particular vehicle described in the complaint was parked in violation of the ordinance together with proof that the Defendant named in the complaint was either the registered owner according to the vehicle registration records of the Secretary of State or the lessee from the registered owner or that the Defendant was the person to whom any University permit affixed to the vehicle was issued shall create in evidence a presumption that the registered owner of the vehicle or the lessee of the registered owner was the person who parked or placed the vehicle at the time and place where the violation occurred.


5.15 A person who violates the provisions of Sections 5.01, 5.02, 5.03, 5.05, 5.07, 5.08, 5.09, 5.11, 5.12, 5.13, or 5.14 of Chapter 5 of this ordinance is responsible for a civil infraction as defined in 1949 P.A. 300 as amended.

5.16 Any provision of this Chapter which describes an act or omission which constitutes a civil infraction under the terms of this Chapter or the Michigan Vehicle Code, being 1949 P.A. 300 as amended, shall be processed as a civil infraction and any person found to have committed a civil infraction may be ordered to pay a civil fine of not more than \$25 and costs in accordance with Section 907 of the Michigan Vehicle Code.


Violation of any other provision of this Chapter not constituting a civil infraction, as herein provided, is a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$25 for each violation.

8.01 **Penalty.** Except as provided in Chapter 5 of this ordinance, any violation of this ordinance shall be a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than \$100 or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or both.

Spencer named

Eugene N. Spencer, former Clawson school superintendent, will assume new duties as assistant to Oakland University President Donald D. O'Dowd.

Spencer will perform a series of special assignments for the university.

The 52-year-old Spencer holds undergraduate and master's degrees from the University of Michigan and the Ph.D. from Wayne State University. Prior to taking the Clawson job in 1961 he was superintendent of schools, Standish-Sterling Board of Education (1957-61), and superintendent of schools, Sterling Board of Education (1955-57). Spencer is a consultant to the new Clawson school superintendent.

Spencer and his wife Betty Lou have two children. The family resides in Clawson.

Eklund appointed

President Carter has appointed Lowell R. Eklund, dean of continuing education, to a three-year term on the National Advisory Council on Extension and Continuing Education.

Dean Eklund is a former president of the National University Extension Association and served on the board of directors of St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Pontiac, the Detroit Osteopathic Hospital Corporation, and the First Methodist Church of Birmingham.

The National Advisory Council on Extension and Continuing Education is a presidential council established by congress in the Higher Education Act. Its major function is to provide policy recommendation to the president and congress on continuing education for adult learners and university-based services to state and local communities.
