Guest speaker Todd Heywood. Heywood has been an active journalist since his first job as an associate editor at age 17 in 1987. His work has uncovered a hate group at Michigan State University, revealed that the Michigan Department of Community Health (MDCH) has been actively tracking and maintaining a database on persons who are tested for HIV, and has been a leading reporter on HIV criminal issues. His work has been cited by the CDC, the Global Commission on HIV and the Law produced by the UN, the U.S. House of Representatives and more. He currently reports for Between The Lines newspaper, City Pulse, HIV Plus Magazine and TheBody.com. In 2011, he was named one of POZ Magazine's top 100 people and ideas changing the fight against HIV, and also named by TheBody.com as "a person making a difference." In 2014, he was the creator of the successful PrEP4ItNow.com HIV testing and prevention initiative touting the benefits of pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) as a prevention option for HIV. He lives in Lansing with his three beloved dogs, Gypsy Rose, Virgil Joshua and Lancelot Gobbo. He has been living with HIV since 2007.
