GRANTS ACCEPTED, FACULTY MEMBER APPOINTED AT NOVEMBER BOARD MEETING

In actions taken by the Michigan State University Board of Trustees last week, several Oakland University items were presented and approved. Included in the gifts and grants accepted for the University were three major grants totaling \$329,035. The largest of two grants for student aid was one in the amount of \$225,244 from the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare for the NDEA Loan Program. A second award from the HEW of \$81,700 was accepted for Education Opportunity Grants for needy students. The third was in the amount of \$22,091 from the Royal Oak City Schools for continued support of the reading and study improvement program, under the direction of Harry Hahn, professor of education.

In other board action, George F. Feeman, member of the faculty of Williams College, was appointed professor of mathematics. Feeman earned his bachelor's degree from Muhlenberg College and his master's and doctorate from Lehigh University.

The Board did not take action on the proposed \$2.4 million remodeling and expansion of the Oakland Center. It is expected that the project will come before the December meeting of the Trustees.
