CONFERENCE TO EXPLORE UNIVERSITY'S ROLE IN SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

An all-day conference will be held Thursday in the Meadow Brook estate clubhouse to acquaint faculty and staff with current and forthcoming programs of the University in the field of social responsibility. The program, to begin at 9 a.m., will cover such areas of concern as involvements in urban affairs, special educational programs for the disadvantaged, and reexamination of University hiring policies. All faculty and staff are invited. Interested persons should contact Gottfried Brieger, chairman of the committee on instruction, by Tuesday.

The morning session will have brief presentations on specific programs or planning. Speakers and their topics will be Glen Brown, admissions; Lowell Eklund, continuing education; Karl Gregory, urban development; George Matthews, black studies; Albert Munson, Black Culture Center; Manuel Pierson, Upward Bound and Project 20; and Gladys Rapoport, financial aid. The afternoon will be devoted to small discussion sessions to be followed by a brief resume from each study section.
