## Cooley offers tuition discount to employees

OU employees and their dependents interested in pursuing a law degree can take advantage of a 50-percent discount off tuition offered by Cooley Law School, beginning immediately. Through this discount, OU faculty and staff, and their dependents can take classes at Michigan's largest law school, including first- and second-year classes right on OU's campus.

Full tuition at Cooley will be reduced to one-half the standard tuition for eligible OU employees. All fees and costs will be charged at standard rates. Cooley operates on a rolling-admissions system, which means applications are processed at the time they are received. Students can begin taking classes in January, May and September.
