## Luellen Ramey

Luellen Ramey, associate professor of counseling, has served as department chair since 1995. During her tenure, a doctoral program in education with an emphasis in counseling was designed and implemented. Recently, the counseling programs in community counseling and school counseling received a full eight-year accreditation from the national counselor education credentialing board, CACREP. Oakland University's counseling program is one of only four programs nationally to receive a full eight-year accreditation.

In addition to serving on the School of Education and Human Service's (SEHS) Executive Committee, Ramey has chaired several faculty searches, served on the SEHS Building Committee, chairs the Counseling department's admissions process, serves on the SEHS Doctoral Program Committee and headed the All-University Fund Drive for her unit.

Ramey currently is co-president of the Michigan Association of Counselor Educators and Supervisors. She teaches clinical courses in the master's and doctoral programs and serves on dissertation committees. She is recognized by students and colleagues for her commitment to teaching and mentoring. Many graduates of the counseling program report that Ramey is tireless in her support and encouragement of them as students and as new professionals. Her scholarly work focuses on clinical work with adults surviving trauma and the ethical decision making of counselor interns. Her clinical research has resulted in professional presentations and publications.
