OU winter enrollment shows increase

Oakland University officials recently announced that winter 2002 enrollment is up 3.2 percent over last year, 7 percent among graduate students and 2.1 percent among undergraduate students.

Winter enrollment stands at 14,813 students, an increase of 454 students over winter 2001, making this Oakland's highest winter enrollment ever.

"Oakland University has become a top choice of students in this region and beyond," said OU President Gary D. Russi. "Our winter 2002 enrollment figures reflect this and demonstrate that we are right on target as we move forward with our Vision 2010 initiative."

Oakland University is a comprehensive state-supported institution of higher education located in Oakland County, Michigan. The university has 110 bachelor degree programs and 70 graduate degree and certificate programs. Dedicated to preparing learners for the 21st-century workplace and society, OU is organized into the **College of Arts and Sciences** and the **Schools of Business Administration, Education and Human Services, Engineering and Computer Science, Health Sciences, Nursing** and the **Honors College**.
