## OU offers services for kids of employees

Oakland University offers many services for children, from toddler, preschool and kindergarten programs at Lowry Center for Early Childhood Education to summer camps in arts, math, science, sports and writing.

### Lowry Center for Early Childhood Education

The Lowry Center for Early Childhood Education offers toddler, preschool and kindergarten programs, giving priority to children of OU students, faculty and staff members.

Lowry's curriculum is designed to promote the cognitive, social and physical development of children in a nurturing environment. The center's teachers are early development specialists with degrees in early childhood and elementary education. Oakland graduate and undergraduate students often are on staff at Lowry, learning the latest teaching methods while the children reap the benefits of their enthusiasm.

Lowry is part of the **School of Education and Human Services (SEHS)** and the Department of Human Development and Child Studies. It is licensed by the State of Michigan and accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children.

Each year, the center offers an Enviro-Explorer's Summer Camp, which gives children from 18 months to 6 years of age a chance to explore science and math and participate in arts and crafts, dramatic play, music, outdoor play and nature walks.

Lowry is at the southeast corner of campus at Adams and Butler roads. Its new location will be in the new SEHS building, which will open in September 2002.

### Summer Camps at Oakland University

Here's a look at OU's many **summer camps** for youths:

#### Arts

They take two four-credit undergraduate courses covering mathematical concepts from probability theory, number theory, group theory, combinatorics, graph theory, statistics and algebra for college credit.
