David Doane

David Doane, professor of decision and information sciences, joined the faculty of Oakland University in 1969.

Doane is the co-recipient of three National Science Foundation grants to develop statistical education software and to create an experimental computer classroom. His current research interests include applied statistics, forecasting and statistical education. He has consulted for government, health care organizations and local firms, and has written textbooks and numerous journal articles.

Doane is the 2002 president of the Detroit chapter of the American Statistical Association and is an active reviewer for professional journals. He was one of the framers of the School of Business Administration constitution and its tenure, promotion and teaching evaluation processes.

Doane also was part of the SBA's successful initial AACSB accreditation team. He served five years as area head and then six more as the first chair of the Department of Decision and Information Sciences.
