PubMed Search Tip of the Month

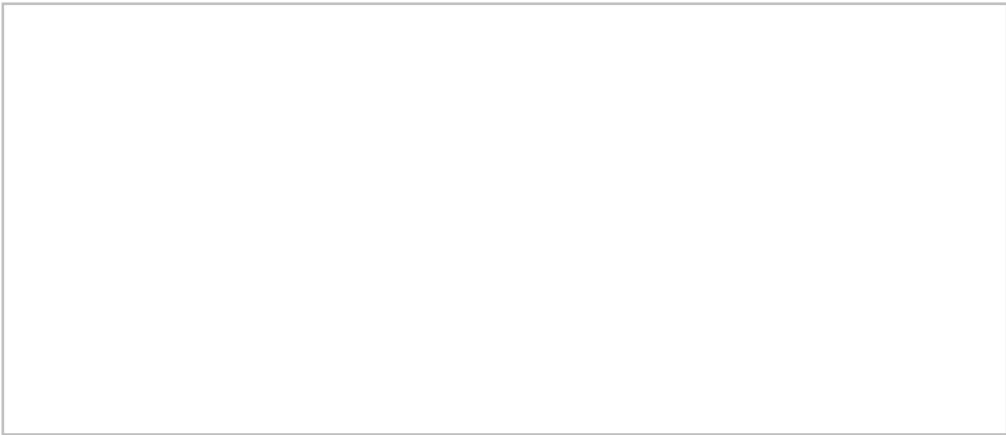
MEDLINE is a database produced by the U.S. National Library of Medicine (NLM) that contains citations and abstracts for articles in the biomedical sciences dating back to 1946. PubMed is the NLM's free interface to the MEDLINE database and provides links to full-text articles found in PubMed Central and on publishers' websites.

Searching PubMed: The Medical Library's website has a PubMed search box embedded on all its pages; a link to PubMed is also included on its "Databases" webpage. While PubMed is free to the general public at pubmed.gov, the links on our website are to a specially constructed URL – <https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pubmed?myncbishare=mioakulib&otool> – that provides access to resources unique to OUWB.

Accessing Full-Text Articles: In order to access the full-text, always start your PubMed search from one of the links on the Medical Library website! (Hint: You can also add this link to your bookmarks or favorites.) This will automatically display the *Kresge Library Get It!* button; clicking the button will allow you to either print the complete article or order a copy via interlibrary loan if it is not immediately available through the library. This is especially important when you are off-campus, where you will be asked to log-in with your OU credentials (the same user name and password you use for email and Moodle).
