ALUMNA HEADS ALUMNI Due to growth in placement office activities and in OU's alumni population, now well over 2,000, the reigns of the alumni relations program are being passed from Dorothy Hope to Mary Schultz, a member of the Charter Class of 1963. The new alumni relations office is in 269 South Foundation (ext. 2324). Mrs. Schultz would appreciate learning of any alumni address changes faculty and staff members may know of, particularly in view of a 10th year reunion proposed for this fall as part of our anniversary celebration.

1,146 ARE ENROLLED The Summer School office reports that there are 1,146 students enrolled this summer, the women outnumbering the men 667 to 479. The breakdown by classes is 138 freshmen, 204 sophomores, 297 juniors, 231 seniors, 258 graduate students, and 18 post-baccalaureate students enrolled in undergraduate courses. There are 205 taking courses on the Oakland campus for the first time, about half of whom are "guest" students from the University of Michigan, Western Michigan, Northern Michigan, and other colleges and universities.

PLAY PROFITS DONATED A contribution of \$300.55 has been made to the Isaac Jones

Memorial Scholarship Fund from the proceeds of the facultystaff play produced, to the glee of the University community, during the spring
term, "Under the Gaslight." The contribution brought the fund donations total
since the start of the second annual fund drive in March to nearly \$1,400. The
goal is \$2,000. "Under the Gaslight" profits provided a similar contribution to the
University for care of the deer herd on the Meadow Brook estate.
