The OUCARES program provides counseling, hosts support groups, and offers therapeutic and recreational programs for families. And our reach proves global as we continue The Oakland University-Guizhou exchange program, sending more than a dozen volunteers to China each year to build cultural bridges and further teacher education on both sides of the world.
