Xiangqun Zeng

In the past year and a half, Xiangqun Zeng, assistant professor of chemistry, has established a vigorous research program at Oakland including a cutting-edge research laboratory that has attracted undergraduate and graduate students, and postdoctoral researchers.

Zeng is a most creative and innovative scientist. This creativity has lead to the submission of six research proposals and very significant external research support. A grant from the American Chemical Society PRF and a recent major interdisciplinary National Institutes of Health (NIH) grant are especially noteworthy. The NIH grant supports work on an important problem -- the rapid and sensitive detection of biological agents. Her success is expected to continue through significant collaborations she has forged with outstanding investigators both inside and outside Oakland University.
