Dems Pressing for Probe Funds

\$300,000 Being Sought to Restudy the Use of U. S. Aid Abroad

WASHINGTON (AP) — Democrats sought \$300,000 today for an exhaustive restudy of the use of American funds abroad as Congress approached final votes on the administration's battered foreign aid program for this fiscal year.

Sen. Mansfield (D-Mont) said he would ask the Senate Rules Committee for endorsement of the amount to finance an inquiry independent investigators under direction of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee.

The committee session was called after Senate and House conferees reached final agreement on a new \$4,014,575,000 foreign aid authorization bill, including \$2,300,000 for military assistance free world allies.

That was nearly 900 millions below the \$4,900,000,000 program military and economic aid originally proposed by President Eisenhower.

Even more drastic was the cut to \$3,665,920,000 in foreign aid appropriations recommended to the House yesterday by a committee which reported out a money bill to finance the spending on which the authorizations simply set ceilings.

Both the House and the Senate still must act on the money bill.

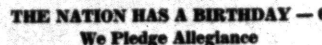
