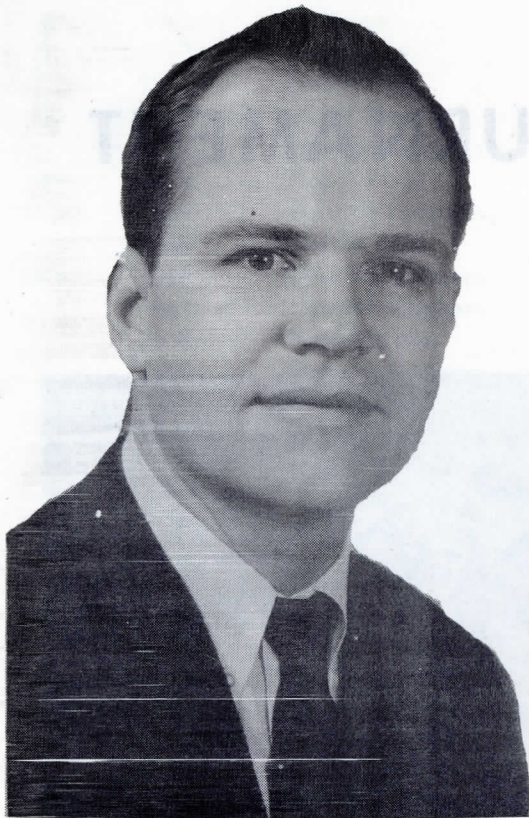

A SALUTE TO CORY VAN FLEET

Cory Van Fleet Director of Physical Education and Athletics here at Oakland University has been a true friend to all the Wrestlers and Wrestling Coaches of Oakland County.

He has advanced in his profession rapidly to his top Athletic Administrative position at Oakland through many years of hard work, advanced professional training, his excellent coaching record at several different high schools, and his outstanding ability to teach and coach, as well as his demonstrated ability as an administrator.

His educational background includes his graduation from Eaton Rapids High School, B.S. and M.S. degrees from Wayne State University. He also has 50 hours credit towards his P.H.D. at Florida State University. Cory is well known throughout the state and nation as a camp director and owner, a public speaker and an outstanding swimming coach. He has done much research in physical education and athletics and has written many articles, some of which have been published in National Journals.

He started his teaching career at Madison High School in 1959 where he initiated the swimming program and they became a swimming powerhouse. He moved to Birmingham Seaholm where his teams won an unprecedented 4 State Swimming Championships between 1960 and 1965.

In 1965 he came to Oakland University and has built them into a traditional power in Swimming. He has also been a Tennis and Soccer coach here as well as a Water Polo coach. He is well respected for his effectiveness in teaching Swimming, Diving and Water Safety courses.

His responsibilities include a seventeen man staff, a \$500,000 budget and a \$6,000,000 physical plant. He is now deeply involved in the development of the fast expanding Physical Education and Athletic Facilities at Oakland University.

Cory is known to all for his never ending smile, a business like approach to his work and for his cooperation and help to those who work with him. Since taking the reins at Oakland as Athletic Director, he has given much time and effort and the cooperation of his staff to make this Wrestling Tournament the finest in the state of Michigan.

HE STANDS ALONE

What high school sport makes the demands on the individual that amateur wrestling does?

When a boy walks onto the mat, he stands alone. No one will run interference, no one will pass him the ball when he is under the net, no one will catch a high fly, if he makes a bad pitch. He stands alone.

In other high school sports, where individual scores are kept, the contest is determined in time, distance and height. But in wrestling, the score is kept on a boy's ability to overcome an opponent in a hand to hand contest, where a two second interval at anytime can mean a loss or a win. If an opponent gains an advantage, there will be no help, no substitutes; there will be no time out and all can be lost in two seconds. Yes, the boy stands alone.

From the spectators standpoint, attention is focused on two boys; not from 100 yards as in some high school sports, but in most contests, just a few feet. Every move can be seen, every act detected. A failure in endurance, in technique, or in courage will be spotlighted.

There is no place on a wrestling team for the show off, the half-hearted, or the weakling. When the whistle blows a boy puts his ability, his determination, and his courage on the line.

We who are close to the young men on our high school wrestling teams have watched the full range of human emotions from elation to heartbreak.

We have seen coaches with tears running down their cheeks as they try to console a young man who has given his all . . . yet lost.

Wrestling is a tough hard sport, and like life, it is the survival of the fittest.

The young men who enter and stay with the team know this. They also know that when the time comes and the whistle blows . . . they stand alone.

TOURNAMENT HISTORY

It was a cold day in November of 1960. Bob Finley, Berkley's veteran wrestling coach, had come over to my house to discuss the possibility of a Christmas Wrestling Tournament. We felt something had to be done. The year before we had entered our teams in the Old Southeastern Michigan Tournament at Garden City High School. There were thirty four teams entered with two men in each weight class from each school. That was the equivalent of an unbelievable sixty-eight teams competing.

The Sunday before the Tournament we had spent twelve long, organizing hours in Ann Arbor just to see the contestants. The first day of the Tournament it took until 3:30 a.m. to get through the second round of this sixty-four bracket tournament. Wrestlers and coaches were falling asleep in the stands. When we got home, the parents had been making frantic calls to our homes inquiring about their sons. We all had to get up with little sleep at 7:00 a.m. to be back in Garden City at 8:30 for the weigh-in. Then the Tournament wore on. We finally finished up at 11:30 Saturday night. The winning coach accepted the trophy with sleepy eyes. We had created a monster.

In December of 1960 a meeting was called at the home of Bob Finley, and the South Oakland County Wrestling Coaches Association was formed to plan a tournament and to improve wrestling. The Association decided that a small tournament for South Oakland County was the answer. It started with eight teams. Permission was granted to use the Berkley Junior High School gym. The starting time was set for a Friday at 5:00 p.m. When we arrived, we encountered our perennial nemesis; the junior high basketball team was practicing and would not get out until 6:00 o'clock. We waited impatiently and finally rolled down the mats, and the first Oakland County Tournament was underway.

For five years after, the Tournament's future was in doubt. It wasn't easy to obtain the use of tournament facilities on our meager budget. But, with the help of Athletic Directors such as Paul Smarks at Fitzgerald, Jack Cotton at Farmington, and Eldon Johnson at Pontiac Northern, we were able to continue. Meanwhile interest had grown and the number of teams had expanded from eight to twenty-two.

In 1966, with the help of Dan Lutkus, Athletic Director of Hazel Park, and the splendid cooperation of Hollie Lepley, Athletic Director at Oakland University, the Tournament was located at this spacious Physical Education Building at Oakland University. It has been here ever since. The Tournament now has thirty-four teams with one man in each weight. The competition is very tough for both team and individual championships. This Tournament is now considered the finest in Michigan.

It is most fitting, therefore, that we salute the hosts and give our grateful thanks to, Mr. Hollie Lepley who as Athletic Director allowed us to use these wonderful facilities and helped us through some tough years, and now to Corey Van Fleet who as present Athletic Director has worked very hard to make this tournament a success.



State Class B Champion and 1974 Oakland County Champion Mike DeGain from Madison will meet head on with Steve Fraser of Hazel Park who is the Defending Oakland County Champion at 185 pounds and a 5th place finisher in the Class A Championships.

DeGain is in a class with former Madison wrestler, Bernie Gonzales who not only won the state Championships and the Oakland County championship but won a gold medal in Tokyo Japan representing the United States on the Junior World team several years ago.

In his wrestling career, Mike has an incredible record posting 81 wins against only 3 losses and one tie. Fifty nine of his 81 victories were by falls. As a sophomore Mike took 2nd place in the Oakland County Tournament and 3rd place in the state. Last year as a junior he had a 44-0-1 record and literally walked through the Oakland County and state championships.

This year the handsome senior has added to his laurels being named all-state in football.

Steve Fraser, a senior at Hazel Park has very impressive credentials also.

He had a 31-3 record last year and was SMA Champion and Oakland County Champion. He also placed 5th in the state at 185 pounds.

It should be noted that Steve wrestled up a weight all last year to accomodate the team even though he could have easily made the 167 pound class.

Steve also was an excellent football player as he captured the Viking team to their 3rd straight SMA football championship. He also led the team in tackles and was selected to the All-SMA team.

Both Mike and Steve played halfback on offense and linebacker on defense. They are both built like bulls with great strength and quickness. They are also very knowledgeable and skillful wrestlers.

This could be one of the finest matches seen at an Oakland Tournament. But both wrestlers beware. There will be several other outstanding wrestlers in that weight, plotting an upset with their eyes on the gold medal. They had both better wrestle one match at a time or one could stumble and not reach the finals.

Defending heavyweight champion Dave Evans will have his hands full this year. Challenging for his crown will be 270 pound Tony Reeves from Ferndale, Greg Castle from Royal Oak Kimball Doug Gildon of Madison will be back as a defending champion. He is entered at 112 pounds this year. Last season he compiled a 38-3 record and has 73-8 career record.

Other wrestlers to watch include Rick Saferian from Hazel Park who was 19-5-1 last year and a regional qualifier. Marvin McClellan of Pontiac Central at 95 pounds placed 6th in the state last year and Dan Roumoy of Walled Lake Western was 31-6 last year.

John Ball of Clawson looks like the favorite at 105 pounds while John Haines of Kimball and Rick Blakey of Pontiac Central look tough at 112 pounds.

Roland Hayword of Clarkston looks like the one to beat at 119 while Chris Sade of Clawson, 4th in the state last year will be tough at 126 pounds.

Joe Faltz of Waterford Kettering and Mike Messer of West Bloomfield are back at 126 pounds.

Jeff Cox of Pontiac Central was 5th in the state last year at 132 and Jeff Jones of Lake Orion had a 19-9 record at the same weight.

Randy Myers a sophomore at Madison, son of coach Jack Meyers, will be tested by Kevin Johns of Farmington Harrison.

SCORING - THE POINT SYSTEM

"MATCH POINTS"

A. TAKEDOWN	(T) 2 points	When a wrestler gets behind or on top of his opponent from the neutral or standing position and controls him on the mat.
B. ESCAPE	(E) 1 point	Coming from the bottom position to a neutral position.
C. REVERSAL	(R) 2 points	Getting out from underneath the opponent and behind or on top of him in one maneuver.
D. NEAR FALL	(NF) 3 points	A near fall that lasts 5 seconds.
E. NEAR FALL	(NF) 2 points	Both shoulders held within four inches of mat momentarily, or one shoulder touching the other within a 45 degree angle momentarily.
F. PENALTY	(P) 1 to 2 points	Awarded to opponent for illegal holds, roughness, technical four, or stalling.
G. RIDING TIME	(RT) 1 to 2 points	The time which one wrestler has control over the other
