VISITORS ON CAMPUS: Mr. Eklund announces that the MSU Cooperative Extension will meet here for a full-day session each Wednesday for the next three weeks beginning November 2. The meeting will be held from 10 to 3 p.m. in Room 173, South Foundation Hall. Topics of the three-day forum will be (1) Inflation, (2) The Role of Women in the Changing Community, led by either Ed Moe or Sheldon Lowry, professors of Sociology and Anthropology, and (3) Aid, Trade and Survival which will be presented by Art Mauch, professor of Agricultural Economics. Mr. Mauch's talk will be based on observations made during a six-weeks' study tour of Pakistan, India, Thailand, Malaya, Australia, the Philippines, Hong Kong and Japan.

Mr. Varner stated that two men are currently under consideration to head the Engineering Science program -- a Mr. Amos Shaler, recently of Pennsylvania State University, and a Mr. Harold Foecke who is with the American Society of Engineering in Urbana, Illinois.

Mr. Hoopes announced that he was preparing a memo to the EPC to discuss the summer school program for 1961 and trailer courses.

Mr. Taulbee, it was said, will keep everyone informed on the Computer Seminars. The Computer Committee would appreciate information from potential users regarding their needs.

Mr. Eklund asked for clarification of faculty participation in the Continuing Education program. Mr. Hoopes stated that any faculty member automatically may teach one course over his regular work schedule.. Beyond this, approval by the Dean of Faculty is necessary.

It was agreed that any matriculated student enrolled in a given term may audit classes in which he has an interest. if the professor in charge permits. No formal record will be kept of audit courses.

Mr. Galloway has offered one of his paintings to MSUO to start its art collection. Mrs. Matthews, Paul Allen and Mr. Varner made the selection for the University.
