## ADMINISTRATIVE GROUP MEETING December 14, 1964

ABSENT: Messrs. Cammack and Hough.

Chancellor Varner will call a student meeting early next semester to discuss the state of the University. Messrs. O'Dowd, Sells and Stoutenburg will be asked to participate.

In response to a letter from Oakland University, Mr. Norman Burns, North Central Association, indicated that Oakland will be visited in the spring of 1966 for the purpose of accreditation.

<u>Chancellor Varner</u> asked whether or not Oakland should ask for representation on MSU committees that were dealing with matters which would lead to recommendations to the Board that would also affect Oakland University. It was agreed that it might be inadvisable at this time, and the question is dropped for now.

<u>Chancellor Varner</u> outlined the various programs that will be undertaken with the Mott Foundation grant. Mr. Eklund has been named Director and will spend two thirds of his time in this new program and one third of his time directing the Oakland University Continuing Education Program.

Mr. Eklund confirmed the participation of Margaret Mead in the series of Symposia sponsored by the Alumni Education at Oakland University. Miss Mead will be on campus May 17-18.

Mr. Hetenyi announced that there are 126 students signed up for internship in the Winter Semester. This is a larger group than he had expected and wondered what part this group would be of the the graduating classes for April and August. Mr. Stoutenburg indicated that there would be approximately 140 graduates in April and about 30 in August.

Mr. Stoutenburg announced that the All-University Christmas Party, sponsored by the Student Finance Committee, is scheduled for December 19.

Mr. Brown stated his concern about the amount of dormitory space available for new students in the fall. He feels that a minimum of 400 students will ask for housing which, by his present estimate, will be 100 more students than we can accommodate.

Mr. McKay reported the National Science Foundation grant obtained by Mr. Herbert Schuel, and that interviewing is now going on for a Mathematics Department Chairman.
