SEHS Hosts Delegation from Iraq

The School of Education and Human Services (SEHS) played host on Tuesday, October 25 to a delegation from Iraq. The group, represented by three members of the Iraqi Parliament and a Washington embassy staffer, has an ambitious goal: to overhaul the teacher education curriculum in Iraqi universities. To help them do this, they seek to develop Iraqi professionals through



undergraduate and graduate degrees and other programs. They have a particular interest in literacy and special education, areas in which they see American schools of education as world leaders. Faculty from the Organizational Leadership, Human Development and Child Studies, Reading and Language Arts, and Teacher Development and Educational Studies departments, along with Outreach and Program Services, held initial conversations with the group. Provost Lentini joined SEHS representatives in hosting a lunch.

Lowry Visits Upland Hills Farm

On Tuesday, October, 18, the Lowry Center had its first center-wide field trip. Approximately 260 people (children, family members, and Lowry staff) visited Upland Hills Farm in Oxford, Michigan.

recognized for the extraordinary leadership and dedication they have shown over the last four years of partnership.


