OU hosting personal financial planning program

According to the Jobs Almanac 2001, financial planning is the number one profession in the nation. To help people become part of this profession, Oakland University's **School of Business Administration** is offering classes in Personal Financial Planning beginning September 17.

The program consists of seven courses designed to give students solid training in the various aspects of the financial planning profession. Each course meets one night per week for 13 weeks. Classes will be held in the evenings at Derby School in Birmingham Monday-Friday, and Saturday mornings at Macomb's University Center in Clinton Township.

The program is a Certified Financial Planner Board-registered program. Upon completion, students earn a certificate in personal financial planning and are eligible to sit for the Certified Financial Planner exam.
