1979-80 OUTLOOK

For the last four years Oakland University basketball and the name Tim Kramer have been synonymous. After all, during his college career, Tim compiled statistics which made him one of Oakland University's greatest players ever. Last year, for example, he led the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) in both scoring and rebounding. With the absence of this star forward, Pioneer basketball will be forced to take on a new, but no less effective, game plan for the 1979-80 season.

"No one player will be considered the 'key to success' but rather the collective group has to adapt to our system and play it consistently," says Lee Frederick, the Pioneers' new head coach. Coming from assistant coaching positions at Northern Michigan University and Western Illinois University, Frederick took over the coaching reins in mid-season last year to guide the Pioneers to six wins in 13 contests.

This season Frederick will be counting on junior forwards Duane Glenn (Detroit/St. Andrew), Wally Plese (Joliet, Ill./West), and Rich Brauer (Detroit/Lutheran West) along with sophomore frontliner Bill Peterson (Livonia/Clarenceville) to collectively replace Kramer. Glenn was the team's second-leading scorer with an 11.6 average and had 85 assists, also second best on last year's squad. Suffering through an injury-prone season, Plese hit 55.0 percent from the field and 85.7 percent from the free throw line last year in 18 games. Brauer averaged 9.9 points and led the team with an 87.5 free throw percentage mark. Peterson finished strong in the 1978-79 season averaging 4.6 points, hitting 50.7 percent from the floor and 73.7 percent from the charity stripe.

Frederick had a successful recruiting season signing freshman Don Young (Detroit/Southeastern). Young averaged nearly 12 points and an amazing 17 rebounds as a guard. The OU coach also inked three junior college transfers to solidify the guard spots. Les Thomas (Cleveland, Ohio/Glenville) averaged 22 points at Eastern Wyoming College and has superior quickness and jumping ability. Clyde Montgomery (Hamtramck/St. Florian) and Mark Mendez (Galesburg, Ill./Galesburg) are both point guards who pride themselves on their ability to set up the offense. Montgomery came to OU via Seminole Junior College in Seminole, Oklahoma, while Mendez attended Carl Sandburg Junior College in his hometown.

"Our new guards are expected to solve our problems at that position," Frederick said. "We should have better penetration, fewer turnovers and better passing, which we hope will lead to more victories."

Holdovers K.C. Forward, a junior from Lathrup Village, and sophomore Dennis Hammond (Davison/Davison) will also give Frederick some experienced backcourt players.

In the middle, junior Dan Rawlings (Franklin, Ill./Franklin) should improve last year's 6.9 scoring and 5.7 rebounding averages. The 6-9 Rawlings hit 51.9 percent from the floor last year. Providing backup to Rawlings will be 7-0 senior Bjorn Rossow (Oslo, Norway). Rossow hit 68.9 percent from the field in 17 contests last season.

The Pioneers' head coach Lee Frederick and assistant coach Steve Hebold will be looking for their first winning season since the 1973-74 campaign when OU posted a 17-11 mark.

OAKLAND UNIVERSITY

Oakland University is a state-funded, four-year institution with an enrollment of more than 11,500 students. Located midway between Rochester and Pontiac, Michigan, the university is approximately 30 miles from all the cultural and entertainment opportunities of America's fifth largest city—Detroit.

Oakland University was founded in 1957 when the late Mr. and Mrs. Alfred G. Wilson donated their 1,600-acre estate and \$2 million to Michigan State University to begin a new college in Oakland County. The university, named Michigan State-Oakland, enrolled its first students in 1959. In 1963 the name was changed to Oakland University and in 1970 the state legislature granted Oakland University its independence.

Since its inception, the university has been committed to offering a diverse set of academic programs. Anchored by a strong liberal arts program, the university is organized into a College of Arts and Sciences, and Schools of Economics and Management, Human and Educational Services, Performing Arts, Engineering, Nursing, a Center for General and Career Studies, and a Center for Health Sciences.

The athletic program strives for continued success in achieving its educational goal of providing total participation within a framework of excellence. Under the guidance of the Director of Athletics Corey Van Fleet, Oakland University's athletic department has grown to 14 sports and offers cardio-vascular rehabilitation and physiology laboratory programs including prescriptive exercises and stress testing.

The Hollie Lepley Sports Center houses a range of facilities for individual and team activities including: a swimming pool; courts for handball, paddleball, badminton, squash, basketball and volleyball; a wrestling room; and an updated weight room. There is also an 18-hole golf course, eight excellent outdoor tennis courts and several well-groomed playing fields. These facilities combined with the university's beautiful wooded landscape and rolling fields make the Oakland campus one of the most ideal environments for sports activities.

Oakland University is a member of the NCAA Division II and the AIAW Division I and the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. Its academic programs are accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.
