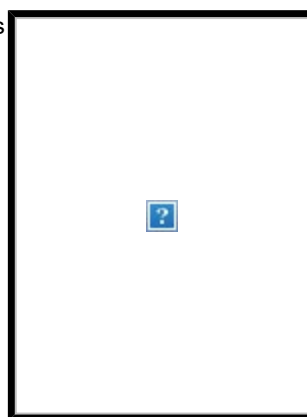
Close the Immunization Gap! World Immunization Week, April 24 - 30

Along with Autism Awareness Month and National Donate Life Month, April is home to World Immunization Week, April 24 - 30, 2015, a campaign to raise awareness and increase rates of immunization on a global scale.

According to the World Health Organization, 1 in 5 children does not receive routine immunizations that could avert 1.5 million deaths each year from preventable diseases.¹

In recognition of the week, the Medical Library has pulled together a list of helpful resources on immunization:

Database of Abstracts of Review of Effects (DARE) was the primary resource for locating critical summaries of systematic reviews and meta-analyses in support of evidence-based medicine.

As of January 2015, no new summaries will be added to DARE as funding has been cut to the National Institute for Health Research's Review & Dissemination Centre (CRD) at the University of York, UK. Summaries up to December 2014 will remain searchable in the old CRD website, but new summaries will be added to the **NIHR Dissemination Centre** beginning this month.
