Keeping Kids Safe: Raising Awareness October through December!

In accordance with Sudden Infant Death Syndrome Awareness Month and the M2 Reproductive course, the Diversity Programming Team presented the Sudden Infant Death Syndrome Lunch 'n Learn for OUWB students, faculty, and staff on October 30. Mary Smyth, MD, Director of the Child Advocacy and Protection Team and Head of the Division of Ambulatory Pediatrics at Beaumont Hospital - Royal Oak and Mary Machowicz, RN, BSN, Program Coordinator at Tomorrow's Child, shared their current education and advocacy initiatives for safe infant sleep practices and infant death prevention. However, increasing SIDS awareness is only one of many ways to promote child health and safety this season.

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The last months of the year focus on the education of families and the community on child safety, health and wellness. October includes not only Sudden Infant Death Awareness, but National Bullying Prevention Month, **Red Ribbon Week** for youth drug prevention education, **Walk to School Day** to promote safe routes and regular exercise, and Child Health Day. To promote child safety during the holiday season, December is also Safe Toys and Gifts Month.

Submit your 2011-2012 Journal Publications for Authors at Oakland!

The Senate Library Committee and Kresge Library are pleased to announce the 8th annual *Authors at Oakland* event to honor faculty who have recently published. This year, following our tradition of celebrating books and journal articles in alternating years, the *Authors at Oakland* event will focus on journal publications. The event will be held on March 20, 2013 from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m., on the 4th floor of Kresge Library.

Authors at Oakland recognizes the breadth of outstanding research that is produced by Oakland faculty; to this end, the committee invites all faculty who have published one or more articles, essays, or creative pieces in peer-reviewed journals in 2011–2012 to submit one of these for recognition at the event. All submissions will be on display, and refreshments will be served. In addition, the Senate Library Committee will invite two authors to present their work at the event. The presentations will be chosen based on their potential appeal to a non-specialist audience and the proposer's ability to articulate the significance and innovation of the research, or in the case of creative writing, the piece's conceptual and aesthetic merits.

This year marks the debut of a web-based submission system. The online form enables authors to upload articles and indicate their interest in making a presentation on their scholarship to a general audience at the March event. All submissions must comply with the following specifications:

- One submission per faculty member
- Peer-reviewed journal publications: appearing in print or electronically between
 January 1, 2011 and December 31, 2012
- Deadline for submission for inclusion in the event is January 11, 2013
