- A. Projects Worked on During the Summer and Currently in Progress
  - 1. Recruiter—a web-based software that will overlay and interface with Banner. A support tool for recruitment, online application, online documentation, recommendation forms. Will create a paperless environment. Projected production for Undergraduate and Graduate in January 2016.
  - 2. Degree Works. Also works with Banner. Will replace CAPP—degree audit processing system. Looking at implementation in October.
  - 3. Course renumbering from 3-digit to 4-digit currently in progress. Anticipated to be effective Fall 2017.

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The council had some discussion about students' OU email and how the accounts expire after one year of no attendance/graduation. If student could keep their OU email accounts for life, it would be beneficial in retention and tracking of alumni. Alumni contact is particularly important in the School of Medicine.
